SUBJECT: Amendments to VAC 20-23-100: Amendments to Licensure Regulations for School Personnel as required by Chapter 546 of the 2022 Acts of Assembly (licensure reciprocity)

I have reviewed the amendments to the regulations identified above in order to determine whether the State Board of Education (Board) has the authority to promulgate the regulations and if the regulations comport with applicable state law.

Pursuant to § 22.1-16 of the *Code of Virginia*, the Board has authority to promulgate regulations to carry out its statutory powers and duties. In addition, pursuant to § 22.1-298.1 of the *Code of Virginia*, the Board of Education has the authority to promulgate regulations related to the requirements for the licensure of teachers and other school personnel required to hold a license.

It is my view that this regulatory action is exempt from Article 2 of the Administrative Process Act by virtue of § 2.2-4006.A.4.a, as this change is “[n]ecessary to

conform to changes in Virginia statutory law or the appropriation act where no agency discretion is involved.” This change is mandated by Chapter 546 of the 2022 Acts of Assembly. It is further my view that this action remains subject to Governor Executive Order 14 (2018)¹, and that the Board has not exceeded its authority.

¹ This Executive Order has been replaced by Executive Order 19 (2022), which by its terms applies to regulatory activity initiated on or after July 1, 2022. The subject regulation was initiated prior to July 1, 2022, and so is not governed by EO 19 (2022).
