VOSH PROGRAM DIRECTIVE: 12-101 ISSUED: April 1, 1995

SUBJECT: Amendments to the Applicability of Standards in 29 CFR Part 1910, §1928.21

# A. <u>Purpose</u>.

This directive transmits to field personnel the above-amended standard.

This Program Directive is an internal guideline, not a statutory or regulatory rule, and is intended to provide instructions to VOSH personnel regarding internal operation of the Virginia Occupational Safety and Health Program and is solely for the benefit of the program. This document is not subject to the Virginia Register Act or the Administrative Process Act; it does not have general application and is not being enforced as having the force of law.

### B. Scope.

This directive applies to all VOSH personnel.

### C. Action.

The Deputy Commissioner, directors and supervisors shall assure that field personnel and employers understand and comply with the provisions of this amended standard.

# D. Effective Date.

June 1, 1995

#### E. Expiration Date.

Not Applicable.

#### F. Background.

By enacting the standard on the Retention of DOT Markings, Placards and Labels, General Industry, §1910.1201, on July 19, 1994, federal OSHA was responding to a congressional mandate under Hazardous Materials Transportation Act of 1990 (HMTUSA). The mandate requires employers, who receive packaging or vehicles containing hazardous materials, to assure the retention of markings, placards and labels and any other information required by Department of Transportation (DOT) regulations

be on the packaging or on vehicles until the hazardous materials have been removed so that a health or safety risk is no longer posed. As such, \$1928.21 needed to be amended to reflect the changes resulting from the promulgation of \$1910.1201.

Additionally, on October 12, 1994, federal OSHA published the revised standard for Logging Operations, General Industry, §1910.266. The revised logging standard expanded the coverage of the old pulpwood logging standard to include <u>all</u> logging operations, regardless of the end use of the wood. As such, §1928.21 needed to be revised so that the standard for Logging Operations, General Industry, §1910.266, will apply to logging operations undertaken in the agricultural industry.

## G. Summary.

As a result of the promulgation of the Retention of DOT Markings, Placards, and Labels in General Industry, §1910.1201, the Applicable Standards in 29 CFR Part 1910, §1928.21, was amended by adding and reserving paragraph (a) (6), and by adding a new paragraph (a) (7) which references the Retention of DOT Markings, Placards, and Labels in General Industry, §1910.1201. The effective date of this amendment is June 1, 1995.

Paragraph (a) (3) of §1928.21, Agriculture Standard, Applicable Standards in 29 CFR Part 1910, was revised to reference the revised general industry standard on "Logging Operations--§1910.266." The effective date of this amendment is June 1, 1995.
