Regulations Governing the Practice of Nurse Practitioners

18VAC90-30-80. Qualifications for initial licensure.

- A. An applicant for initial licensure as a nurse practitioner shall:
- 1. Be currently licensed as a registered nurse in Virginia or hold a current multistate licensure privilege as a registered nurse;
- 2. Submit evidence of a graduate degree in nursing or in the appropriate nurse practitioner specialty from an educational program designed to prepare nurse practitioners that is an approved program as defined in 18VAC90-30-10;
- 3. Submit evidence of professional certification that is consistent with the specialty area of the applicant's educational preparation issued by an agency accepted by the boards as identified in 18VAC90-30-90;
- 4. File the required application; and
- 5. Pay the application fee prescribed in 18VAC90-30-50.
- B. Provisional licensure may be granted to an applicant who satisfies all requirements of this section with the exception of subdivision A 3 of this section only until the release of the results of the first national certifying examination for which he is eligible following his application, provided the board has received evidence of the applicant's eligibility to sit for the certifying examination directly from the national certifying body. An applicant may practice with a provisional license for either six months from date of issuance or until issuance of a permanent license or until he receives notice that he has failed the certifying examination, whichever occurs first.
