In order to reduce an accumulated surplus in the budget of the Board of Veterinary Medicine, a one-time reduction in renewal fees has been adopted. The renewal fee for veterinarians will be reduced for the renewal date of December 31, 2005 from \$135 to \$100; for veterinary establishments, the fee will be reduced from \$140 to \$120; for veterinary technicians, the renewal fee will be reduced from \$30 to \$25. Fees for inactive licensure (which are approximately one-half the active renewal fee) and late fees for sending a renewal after the deadline (which are approximately one-third the renewal fee) are reduced correspondingly.

This action is exempt from the Virginia Administrative Process Act in § 2.2-4006 A 7: "Regulations of the regulatory boards served by (i) the Department of Labor and Industry pursuant to Title 40.1 and (ii) the Department of Professional and Occupational Regulation or the Department of Health Professions pursuant to Title 54.1 that are limited to reducing fees charged to regulants and applicants."
