On February 25, 2016, the Virginia General Assembly approved HB 435, amending the *Code of Virginia* at 63.2-1701, exempting adult day care centers (ADCC) from the requirement to be licensed by the Virginia Department of Social Services (VDSS) if they provide services only to individuals enrolled in Programs of All Inclusive Care for the Elderly (PACE). Current Department of Medical Assistance Services regulations require that all PACE programs must be licensed by VDSS as an Adult Day Health Center (ADHC), which is the same as an ADCC (according to the definition set forth in 12VAC30-50-330). As the Code has been amended to strike the ADCC requirement for those programs serving only individuals enrolled in PACE, the DMAS regulation no longer conforms to *Code*. Regulatory action is needed to amend

regulations to remove the requirement that PACE programs be licensed as Adult Day Care Centers (also referred to as Adult Day Health Care Centers) in 12 VAC 30-50-335(F).

The *Code of Virginia* (1950) as amended, § 32.1-325, grants to the Board of Medical Assistance Services the authority to administer and amend the Plan for Medical Assistance. The *Code of Virginia* (1950) as amended, § 32.1-324, authorizes the Director of DMAS to administer and amend the Plan for Medical Assistance according to the Board's requirements. The Medicaid authority as established by § 1902 (a) of the *Social Security Act* [42 U.S.C. 1396a] provides governing authority for payments for services.

HB 435, passed during the 2016 Virginia General Assembly session, changes the requirements for PACE organizations. This change in state law requires DMAS to change its regulations so that they conform with state law.

Substance

Currently, the Virginia Program of All-Inclusive Care for the Elderly (PACE) regulations require PACE organizations in the Commonwealth must be licensed as an Adult Day Care Center. This licensing process is completed by the Virginia Department of Social Services.

During the 2016 session of the Virginia General Assembly, legislation was passed (HB 435) amending the *Code of Virginia* §63.2-1701 to remove the requirement that PACE organizations be licensed as Adult Day Care Centers. The Virginia PACE regulations are now in conflict with the *Code*.

DMAS proposes to amend the General PACE Plan Requirement regulation (12 VAC 30-50-335) to remove section F, which is the section requiring PACE organizations sites within the Commonwealth to be licensed as an Adult Day Care Center.
