This regulatory action is in compliance with Chapter 572 of the 2018 Acts of Assembly, which directs the State Board of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services to promulgate regulations within 280 days to include 'licensed behavior analyst' (LBAs) in the definition of licensed mental health professional (LMHPs). The enacting legislation was uncontested in both chambers; the issue was noncontroversial. There are no projected costs to these changes.

The current Licensing Regulations will be amended as follows:

"Licensed mental health professional (LMHP)" means a physician, licensed clinical psychologist, licensed professional counselor, licensed clinical social worker, licensed substance abuse treatment practitioner, licensed marriage and family therapist, or certified psychiatric clinical nurse specialist, or licensed behavior analyst.

The amendment to the Licensing Regulations was approved at the April 11, 2018, meeting of the State Board as a fast track action.

These amendments are noncontroversial. LBAs have been a licensed profession in Virginia since the 2012 General Assembly established the profession (2012 Acts of Assembly, Chapter 3) and since then, LBAs have been active in the DBHDS system.
