## CIRCULAR LETTER 94-I

TO: ALL WHOLESALE BEER, WINE AND FARM WINERY LICENSEES

SUBJECT: SECTION § 4.1-225 ET SEQ., CODE OF VIRGINIA; SUSPENSION OF

LICENSES

<u>PURPOSE</u>: The purpose of this Circular Letter is to advise those addressed that Circular Letter 93-1 is being rescinded effective April 1, 1994. The Board is of the opinion that an A.B.C. license should not be kept upon the premises during the period of suspension. Consequently, effective on the above date, all such licenses suspended following the Administrative Hearing Process will be surrendered to a Special Agent of the Board for retention and reinstatement pursuant to the terms of the Final Order. In addition, all privileges of the license, including purchasing and selling alcoholic beverages, are prohibited during the period of suspension.

**BACKGROUND**: Recently, the Board has been requested to reconsider its policy with respect to the suspension of licenses and, in particular, whether the licensee should retain the privilege of purchasing alcoholic beverages during such suspension.

<u>HELD:</u> On or after April 1, 1994, the purchase and sale of alcoholic beverages will be prohibited during the period of suspension. Furthermore, the license document will be surrendered to the Board's Special Agent.
