The authority for this regulation is contained in §§ 3.2-109 and 3.2-4763 of the Code of Virginia. These sections authorize the Board of Agriculture and Consumer Services to adopt such rules and regulations as may be necessary to carry out the administration and enforcement of Chapter 47, Article 4 of Title 3.2 of the Code, commonly referred to as the Grain Dealers Licensing and Bonding Law. There is no state or federal mandate for this regulation.

The alternative considered was to have no regulation at all. If there were no regulation, then there would be no third party assuring farmers of prompt payment for their grain, or, in the case of default by the grain dealer, there would be no recourse for farmers to seek payment for their losses.

This regulation specifies the information that must be recorded by grain dealers in grain transactions with farmers. This review by VDACS ensures that Virginia farmers are promptly and properly paid for their grain and provides an accounting of amounts owed in the event of non-payment of grain by the grain dealer. In many cases, these grain transactions are for large amounts of money. Therefore, the regulation implements a law that helps to protect farmers from loss of income.

The agency has determined that this regulation is effective in achieving its goals of protecting Virginia farmers against loss when selling their grain. No complaints or comments were received during the public comment period. The regulation does not conflict with state or federal law. The regulation is not overly complex. The agency has determined that no change occurred in the area affected by the regulation subsequent to the agency's previous periodic review that would necessitate the amendment or repeal of this regulation. This regulation is still very important in ensuring fair and prompt payment for grain transactions between buyer and seller.
