Pursuant to Section 3.2-703 of the *Code of Virginia*, the Board of Agriculture and Consumer Services may quarantine the Commonwealth or any portion thereof to prevent or slow the spread of a pest into, within, or from the Commonwealth.

#### Alternatives

Please describe all viable alternatives for achieving the purpose of the existing regulation that have been considered as part of the periodic review process. Include an explanation of why such alternatives were rejected and why this regulation is the least burdensome alternative available for achieving the purpose of the regulation.

A viable alternative to 2VAC3-325 et seq., Regulations Governing Pine Shoot Beetle, does not exist.

The purpose of this regulation is to slow the artificial spread of the pine shoot beetle from infested areas to non-infested areas by restricting the movement of regulated articles from regulated localities to unregulated localities. This regulation is the least burdensome approach to slowing the artificial spread of the pine shoot beetle, as the regulation only includes as regulated localities those in which the pine shoot beetle has been detected. Without this regulation, the U.S. Department of Agriculture, Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service may elect to issue a

federal quarantine that would encompass all of Virginia and would place restrictions on businesses in non-infested areas of Virginia that are not currently subject to the provisions of this regulation.

This regulation has a minimal economic impact on small businesses. The agency has determined this regulation is necessary in order to continue to slow the artificial spread of the pine shoot beetle from infested areas to non-infested areas. The agency has determined that the regulation is not unnecessarily burdensome or complex. The agency has not received any complaints or comments from the public regarding the regulation.

Section 3.2-703 of the Code provides the Commissioner of Agriculture and Consumer Services with the authority to expand or reduce a quarantine's regulated area. The regulation was last amended to expand the regulated area in November 2010. No significant changes to technology, economic conditions, or other factors have occurred that would necessitate additional amendments to this regulation.

The pine shoot beetle is a federally regulated pest. Currently, the regulated areas under the federal pine shoot beetle quarantine mirror the regulated areas included in Virginia's quarantine. Without this regulation, the U.S. Department of Agriculture, Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service may elect to issue a federal quarantine that would encompass all of Virginia and would place restrictions on businesses in non-infested areas of Virginia that are not currently subject to the provisions of this regulation. As such, the agency recommends that the regulations stay in effect without change.
