If the provision of 12VAC35-115-130 B.2. was modified to remove the reference to 12 VAC35-180, the Board could ask the Attorney General to identify additional agency policy and provisions in 12VAC35-115 that would be needed so that the requirements of §32.1-162 and §37.2-402 were addressed in 12VAC35-115 and DBHDS policy. The Board will be considering modifications to 12VAC35-115 at a meeting later in the year.
