The following **requirements are not met** by this nursing education program:

- There are no objectives for the prevention of abuse, neglect, and abandonment in the traditional program's syllabi; 18VAC90-20-120.B.5.c
- 2. There are no objectives for patient rights in either program's syllabi; 18VAC90-20-120.B.5.b
- 3. There is no objective for the role of the nurse in cases of suspected child abuse in either program's syllabi; **18VAC90-20-120.D**
- 4. There is no objective for the delegation of nursing tasks in either program's syllabi; **18VAC90-20-120.C.4**
- 5. The practitioner being prepared is not identified as an entry-level provider of care: **18VAC90-20-80.2**
- 6. The faculty to precepted student ratio is 1:25. This does not meet the requirement of the regulations which permits a faculty to precepted student ratio of "up to 15 students." **18VAC90-20-90.B.3**
- 7. The role and responsibility of the faculty is not addressed in the preceptor packet as is required in **18VAC90-20-95.D.4**
- 8. There are no graduate or employer evaluations specific to nursing in place; **18VAC90-20-130.A**
- 9. The list of nursing videos utilized in the skills labs reveals that most of the resources are very out-dated; **18VAC90-20-130.D**

The following **suggestions** are made for program improvement:

- 1. The Dean and faculty may wish to expand the topical outline that discusses disaster planning to include "bioterrorism;"
- 2. The Dean and faculty may wish to review, revise, and/or redevelop the objectives that are concerned with laws and regulations that govern the practice
- 3. The Dean and faculty may wish to clarify the use of the comprehensive exam given to students at the end of the program; and
- 4. Notify the Board when the move to the new building is complete so that a site visit can be scheduled.
