

## ***Act Now to Influence a Major Change in Transportation Policy***

***Transportation funding is scarce and it's important that Virginia adopt a more strategic approach to transportation planning. Join aviation, transit, rail, freight, highway, and port representatives at one of the many upcoming meetings around the state to review and comment on a new transportation plan and a new way of selecting projects for funding.***

***Why should you attend?*** Because you can influence policies that drive future funding, project priorities and decisions. Don't leave your transportation future, or that of your children's to chance – get involved!

Four state transportation agencies have spent three years crafting a statewide, multi-modal 20-year long-range plan called *VTrans2025*. The first of this magnitude in the state's history, the plan proposes priority consideration for projects that connect modes of travel.

You'll also have an opportunity to review and comment on long-range plans from the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) Department of Rail and Public Transportation (DRPT) and see the Virginia Port Authority (VPA) and Department of Aviation's (DOAV) plans.
