

Brochure Update

New/revised brochure was passed around for review and comment. Joan Rokus recommended that the County provide an update to Chairman York and Board of Supervisors. There was a short discussion on funding of the brochures for printing and mailing. Dave Ward with Building and Development felt they could provide the printing for mailing. Mark Novak was to provide list of names and address that was used for the last mailing. However, cost of stamps and how to fund the mailing was an issue. It was suggested that the committee consider looking into creating a facebook account to post the brochure on to avoided mailing cost. Ben Lawrence made a few suggestions on labeling the pictures show as to their location. To avoid having to wait till next committee meeting, a motion was made by Joan Rokus to allow for the chairman to approve all edits without committee review seconded by Ben Lawrence, approved unanimously.

Anne Larson presented her annual scenic river calendar, and this year it included historic and contemporary photos of both Goose and Catoclin Creeks. She mentioned that due to costs, limited copies of the calendar were originally made. She commented that many people nowadays may be more interested in a scrapbook of photos instead of a calendar.

Anne mentioned that her work on previous years' calendars won her a Loudoun History Award from Balch Library. She also announced that the annual Catoclin Creek photo contest will be held again at the Waterford Fair on October 1-3.

Status of Culverts

Chairman Peterson provided an update on the status of the culverts that were washed into the Goose Creek below Cotton Bridge. A meeting with the Department of Parks Recreation and Community Service took place on site at Keep Loudoun Beautiful Park to discuss using the park for staging and recovery operations. PRCS had concerns with use of vehicles (ATV) in the Goose Creek without approval from appropriate state or county agencies. Chairman Peterson will work with the Department of Building and Development to obtain approval.

Committee Business

Anne Larson stated that the 40th Anniversary display board will be housed at Loudoun Valley High School. Catoclin Creek is looking into restating the committee for Catoclin Scenic River. They will be working with Lynn Crump from DCR, they are looking to extend beyond Waterford.

There being no further Committee business, the meeting was adjourned at 2:30 p.m.
