Ms. Burtner called the meeting to order and reminded members that the focus of the meeting would be Part XIII, the fees section.

She noted that a separate subcommittee had been meeting to address technical criteria.

Ms. Burtner referenced the *Working Draft for Part XIII of the Stormwater Regulations*. Copy included as Attachment #1.

Mr. Hill reviewed the document.

Ms. Burtner noted that, after Mr. Hill's initial review, the committee would work through the document section by section.

Ms. Burtner walked the committee through the document.

4VAC50-60-700. Purpose.

There were no comments.

4VAC50-60-710. Definitions.

This section was deleted as definitions are included elsewhere.

4VAC50-60-720. Authority.

Ms. Burtner noted that this was existing language.

4VAC50-60-730. Applicability.

Under part B a member asked the purpose for requiring an individual permit after a general permit is lost.

Mr. Hill explained that if the situation required the revocation of the coverage under general permit, the developer would need to apply for an individual permit to address the areas of concern.

A member noted that certain localities will be issuing general coverage under the permit, but only the state could issue individual permits. The member asked if DCR would be developing protocol for local governments. What consistency will there be for determining noncompliance.

Mr. Hill said that general noncompliance would not automatically mean revocation of coverage under the general permit.

4VAC50-60-740. Exemptions.

A member noted that the section did not specify who decided what constitutes a minor modification.

It was noted that the EPA has specific language regarding minor modifications.

Mr. Hill noted that the definition was in the Regulations.

<u>4VAC50-60-750.</u> Due dates for Virginia Stormwater Management Program (VSMP) Permits.

A member asked if this is the first time the committee was seeing permit maintenance fees.

A member noted that DEQ requires this for individual permits.

Mr. Dowling noted that this would be addressed in the fee tables. There is a placeholder for that fee, but the current amount was set at zero.

A member asked for clarification on the term "maintenance fees."

Mr. Hill said that the maintenance fee would apply when a project continues for more than a year. A maintenance fee would be assessed on the project approval anniversary date.

4VAC50-60-760. Method of payment.

Mr. Hill noted that this section may be re-titled.

4VAC50-60-770. Incomplete payments and late payments.

Mr. Hill said the intent of this section was to give localities every opportunity to collect the fees.

It was noted that this section came originally from the DEQ regulations to deal with nonpayment.

4VAC50-60-780 Deposit and use of fees.

Members expressed concern about the amount of fees and the percentage to be forwarded to DCR.

DCR staff agreed to collect additional data on this section.

4VAC50-60-790. General.

A member asked for an explanation of what was covered in the permit.

It was noted that the language in this section needed additional edits.

At this time, the committee took a break. Upon return from the break, Ms. Burtner noted that the remainder of the document dealt with fee schedules.

Ms. Burtner referenced two additional documents that dealt with how staff arrived at the fees.

First was a handout from the August 29 subcommittee meeting entitled "Time Estimates for General Permit and Stormwater Management Programs General Permit for Construction Activities."

A copy of this document is included as Attachment #2.

A member noted it was difficult to state specifically how many hours were spent on a project.

Mr. Street gave an overview of the subcommittee meeting held on October 12. Minutes from that meeting are available from DCR.

Mr. Street said the purpose was to determine what methods were available for dealing with nitrogen and phosphorus. In addition the committee examined the cost of in lieu of fees and pro rata shares.

Mr. Street said that some issues still need to be further developed.

He said the subcommittee would continue to meet and work on this issue.

Following lunch the committee resumed discussion of the working draft.

4VAC50-60-800. Fee schedules for VSMP Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System new permit insurance.

A member suggested breaking the fees into a graduated scale based on the type of MS4.

<u>4VAC50-60-810.</u> Fee schedules for major modification of <u>MS4</u> individual permits requested by the permittee.

There were no comments regarding this section.

4VAC50-60-820. Fees for individual or general permits issued by the permit-issuing authority for discharges of stormwater from construction activities.

A member suggested that the title should read from "construction and post-construction" activities.

It was noted that rounding the numbers would make the administration of the fees simpler.

<u>4VAC50-60-825. Fees for the modification of individual permits or the</u> <u>modifications or transfer of Registration statements for the General Permit for</u> <u>Discharges of Stormwater from Construction Activities.</u>

It was noted that the title and the narrative were inconsistent. This will be edited.

4VAC50-60-830. Permit maintenance fees.

Concerns were expressed about the amount of fees. DCR staff will review this section.

At the conclusion of the document review, Ms. Burtner noted that a full meeting of the TAC was scheduled for October 26.

Mr. Dowling thanked members for their participation. He said that staff would be in contact with the group as issues moved forward.

The meeting was adjourned.

Attachment #1

Part XIII Fees

4VAC50-60-700. Purpose.

Sections <u>10.1-603.4</u> and <u>10.1-603.5</u> of the Code of Virginia authorize the establishment of a statewide fee schedule for stormwater management and state agency projects. These regulations in this <u>This</u> part establish establishes the fee assessment and the collection and distribution system for those fees.

4VAC50-60-710. Definitions.

The following words and terms used in this chapter have the following meanings: "Permit applicant" means for the purposes of this part any person submitting a permit application for issuance, reissuance, or modification, except as exempted by 4VAC50-60-740, of a permit or filing a registration statement or permit application for coverage under a general permit issued pursuant to the Act and this chapter.

"Permit application" means for the purposes of this part the forms approved by the Virginia Soil and Water Conservation Board for applying for issuance or reissuance of a permit or for filing a registration statement or application for coverage under a general permit issued in response to the Act and this chapter. In the case of modifications to an existing permit requested by the permit holder and not exempted by 4VAC50-60-740, the application shall consist of the formal written request and any accompanying documentation submitted by the permit holder to initiate the modification.

4VAC50-60-720. Authority.

The authority for this part is pursuant to §§10.1-603.4 and 10.1-603.4:1 of the Code of Virginia and enactment clause 7 governing the transfer of the relevant provisions of Fees for Permits and Certificates Regulations, 9VAC25-20, in accordance with Chapter 372 of the 2004 Virginia Acts of Assembly.

4VAC50-60-730. Applicability.

A. This part applies to:

1. All permit applicants for issuance of persons seeking coverage of a MS4 system under a new permit or reissuance of an existing permit, except as specifically exempt under 4VAC50-60-740 A. The fee due shall be as specified under 4VAC50-60-800 or 4VAC50-60-820.

2. All permittees who request that an existing <u>MS4 individual</u> permit be modified, except as specifically exempt under 4VAC50-60-740 - 100 ft his chapter. The fee due shall be as specified under 4VAC50-60-810.

<u>3. All persons seeking coverage under the General Permit for Discharges of</u> <u>Stormwater From Construction Activities or a person seeking an individual permit for</u> <u>Discharges of Stormwater From Construction Activities. The fee due shall be as</u> <u>specified under 4VAC50-60-820.</u> <u>4. All permittees who request modifications to or transfers of their existing</u> registration statement for coverage under a General Permit for Discharges of Stormwater From Construction Activities. The fee due shall be as specified under 4VAC50-60-825 in addition to any additional fees necessary pursuant to 4VAC50-60-820 due to an increase in acreage.

B. An applicant for a permit involving a permit that is to be revoked and reissued Persons who are applicants for an individual permit as a result of existing permit revocation shall be considered an applicant for a new permit. The fee due shall be as specified under 4VAC50-60-800.

Persons whose coverage under the <u>General Permit for Discharges of Stormwater</u> <u>From Construction Activities has been revoked shall reapply for an individual permit for</u> <u>Discharges of Stormwater From Construction Activities</u>. The fee due shall be as specified under 4VAC50-60-820.

C. Permit maintenance fees Permit and permit coverage maintenance fees may apply to each Virginia Stormwater Management Permit (VSMP) permit holder. The fee due shall be as specified under 4VAC50-60-830.

4VAC50-60-740. Exemptions.

No permit application fees will be assessed to:

1. Permittees who request minor modifications or minor amendments to permits as defined in 4VAC50-60-10.

2. Permittees whose permits are modified or amended at the initiative of the permit-issuing authority.

4VAC50-60-750. Due dates for Virginia Stormwater Management Program (VSMP) Permits.

A. Permit application fees for all new permit applications are due on the day a permit application is submitted and shall be <u>Requests for a permit modification</u>, or general permit coverage shall not be processed until the fees required pursuant to this <u>part are</u> paid in accordance with 4VAC50-60-760. Applications will not be processed without payment of the required fee.

B. A permit application fee is due on the day a permit application is submitted for a major modification that occurs (and becomes effective) before the stated permit expiration date. There is no application fee for a major modification or amendment that is made at the permit-issuing authority's initiative.

<u>CB</u>. Permit Individual permit or general permit coverage maintenance fees shall be paid <u>annually</u> to the permit-issuing authority by October 1 of each year the anniversary <u>date of permit issuance or general permit coverage</u>. No permit will be reissued or automatically continued without payment of the required fee. <u>General Permit coverage</u> <u>maintenance fees shall be applied until a Notice of Termination has been received and</u> <u>approved.</u>

MS4 permittees currently paying maintenance fees on October 1 of each year shall continue to pay the maintenance fee on October 1 until their current permit expires. Upon reissuance of the MS4 permit, maintenance fees shall be paid on the anniversary date of the reissued permit. Effective April 1, 2005, any permit holder whose permit is effective as of April 1 of a given year (including permits that have been administratively continued) shall pay the permit maintenance fee or fees to the permit issuing authority by October 1 of that same year.

4VAC50-60-760. Method of payment.

A. Fees shall be submitted electronically or be paid by check, draft or postal money order payable to:

<u>1. the The Treasurer of Virginia, for a MS4 individual or general permit or for a coverage issued under the General Permit for Discharges of Stormwater From</u> <u>Construction Activities by the Department</u>, to the permit-issuing authority, and must be in U.S. currency, except that agencies and institutions of the Commonwealth of Virginia may submit Interagency Transfers for the amount of the fee. To pay electronically, go to the Department of Conservation and Recreation's stormwater management section of the Department's Department of Conservation and Recreation's public website at http://www.dcr.virginia.gov. Fees not submitted electronically shall be sent to the following address: Virginia Department of Conservation and Recreation, Division of Finance, Accounts Payable, 203 Governor Street, Richmond, VA 23219.

<u>2. The local program authority, for coverage issued under the General Permit for</u> <u>Discharges of Stormwater From Construction Activities by a local program, and must be</u> <u>in U.S. currency.</u>

B. Required information <u>for Department issued permits or permit coverage</u>: All applicants for new permit issuance, permit reissuance, or permit modification shall submit the following information along with the fee payment or utilize the Department of Conservation and Recreation Permit Application Fee Form:

1. Applicant name, address and daytime phone number.

2. Applicant Federal Identification Number (FIN).

3. The name of the facility/activity, and the facility/activity location.

4. The type of permit applied for.

5. Whether the application is for a new permit issuance, permit reissuance or permit modification.

6. The amount of fee submitted.

7. The existing permit number, if applicable.

4VAC50-60-770. Incomplete payments and late payments.

All incomplete payments will be deemed as nonpayments.

Interest may be charged for late payments at the underpayment rate set out by the U.S. Internal Revenue Service established pursuant to 6621(a)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code. This rate is <u>prescribed set forth</u> in 58.1-15 of the Code of Virginia and is calculated on a monthly basis at the applicable periodic rate.

A 10% late payment fee may be charged to any delinquent (over 90 days past due) account.

The permit-issuing authority is entitled to all remedies available under the Code of Virginia in collecting any past due amount and may recover any attorney's fees and/or other administrative costs incurred in pursuing and collecting any past due amount. (Can this apply to localities?)

4VAC50-60-780. Deposit and use of fees.

All fees collected by the board-local program or department in response to this chapter shall be deposited into a special nonreverting fund.

<u>1. Fees collected by the Department shall be deposited into known as</u> the Virginia Stormwater Management Fund established by, and shall be used and accounted for as specified in §10.1-603.4:1 of the Code of Virginia. Fees collected by the Department shall be exempt from statewide indirect costs charged and collected by the Department of Accounts.

2. Fees collected by a local program shall be deposited into a special fund created by the program authority and used to carry out the local program's responsibilities per Part II and Part IIIA of these regulations.

Whenever the board has delegated a stormwater management program to a locality local program or is required to do so by the Act, no more than 30% of the total revenue generated by the statewide stormwater management fees collected within the locality shall be remitted to the State Treasurer for deposit in the Virginia Stormwater Management Fund.

4VAC50-60-790. General.

Each permit application for a new permit each permit application for reissuance of a permit, each permit application for major modification of a permit, and each revocation and reissuance of a permit is a The fees for permits, permit coverage, permit modification, or permit transfers are considered separate actions and shall be assessed a separate fee, as applicable. The fees for each type of permit that the permit-issuing authority has the authority to issue, reissue or modify will be as specified in this part.
