Program Spotlight - Caren Phipps, Education Services for Children

DBVI currently has a total of 2,312 open cases classified as students to Ed Coordinators. The breakdown of ages includes 0-5 years old: 339, with 0-2 year olds making up 100 cases. DBVI wants to reach out to the families earlier to be able to see us as a valuable partner with their child. Education Services have three full-time and three part-time Education Coordinators who serve all of the six regional offices.

The Education Coordinators provide the following services for children and students:

- perform functional vision assessments;
- support parents and professionals who are involved in homeschooling children and students;
- attend IEP/IFSP/Eligibility meetings upon request;
- facilitate access to adaptive developmental /educational materials through the Library and Resource Center (LRC);
- and provide training and consultative services.

Examples of outreach efforts in 2016-17 for children age 13 and younger and their families that DBVI has collaborated on include:

- Audible Easter Egg Hunts, which were held in five of the six regions;
- two Sounds of the James River and nature related activities;
- two Fishing Derbies; other nature related programs;
- Assistive Technology demonstrations;
- information fairs;

- an open house for home schooled students and families at DBVI in Richmond with hands on activities relating to vision loss and blindness;
- and science programs by Jefferson Lab in Newport News in three regions.

In addition, DBVI has an initiative under way to provide Sensory Quilts to every family of a child age 0-3 during the home visit in order to assist in developing rapport and to provide the family with a tangible reminder of our commitment to assist them in accessing resources. The quilt has the added advantage of being able to be used not only by the family as a teaching tool, as the back of the quilt is black for contrast, but also for other professionals to use as they work with the child and family.

Education Services also supports a camp experience for blind, vision impaired and deafblind students age 8 through 18 every summer. The enrollment at Super Summer Camp increased this year over last year and an Open House will be held on the first day of camp to allow students and families to visit and increase their comfort level before the student attends camp. Several volunteer Counselor in Training (CIT) positions are being put in place for older students who are interested in building mentoring skills and having a work experience.
