	VHHA's VNPC Maternal Health Dashboard Data Limitations: Shannon Pursell
	Shannon Pursell presented the status of current projects at VNPC related to maternal health and health data. She presented the most recent preliminary data on maternal mortality, highlighting the increase in Virginia's maternal mortality rate and the persistent racial disparity. She updated the Task Force on new data points being captured including severe maternal morbidity, COVID-19, and mental health. She reported on continued work with Veterans' Affairs to try to capture Tricare enrollment in the dashboard.
	Ms. Pursell noted the limitations of the data collected, due to the claims data being reported only with births. She explained that providing public access to the dashboard is not currently possible due to the terms of existing data sharing agreements and confidentiality requirements of protecting patients' information.
	Unite Virginia and Maternal Health: Jacque Hale
	Jacque Hale presented the history and purpose of Unite Us, and Unite Virginia. The Task Force was presented with a snapshot of the data collection platform utilized by Unite Us. Social Care Management is the leading program type. Jacque presented on Unite Virginia's current health systems, health plans, home visiting programs, doula programs, and local service partners for maternal health. She explained their outcome-focused solutions approach to services, and how their data trends can be used to answer questions and create increased partnerships as needed.

	<ul> <li>Drafted recommendation related to MMRT was found to have been</li> </ul>		
	recently acted on during 2023 General Assembly.		
	<ul> <li>Drafted recommendation for expansion of VNPC Maternal Health</li> </ul>		
	Dashboard was found not feasible and was amended to instead		
	recommend a publicly available report from VNPC in partnership with		
	other necessary data sources.		
	<ul> <li>Drafted recommendation related to screenings during initial prenatal</li> </ul>		
	visit/postpartum visit, was found not feasible as written. It was amended		
	to include payers' role in reimbursement, incentivizing providers to learn		
	how to screen, and bring in community workers to ensure access to		
	identified services are available.		
	• Lastly, in alignment with mandates 4 and 5, and HB 1567 passed during GA		
	Session 2023, the Task Force recommended the support of adoption of		
	perinatal health hubs throughout the Commonwealth.
