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EXCERPT FROM THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE STATE WATER CONTROL BOARD AT ITS MEETING ON MARCH 30, 2015

MINUTE NO. 2 - General VPDES Permit for Seafood Processing Facilities (9VAC25-115)

Prior to the meeting the Board was provided materials including a briefing memo to the Board which included the regulation showing proposed amendments and the agency townhall background document. Elleanore Daub from the Office of VPDES Permits presented a summary of the comments, technical advisory committee membership and indicated the changes proposed were not significant.

Based on the briefing material and the staff presentation, the Board voted unanimously to authorize a public comment period and public hearing for amendment and reissuance of the General VPDES Permit for Seafood Processing Facilities, 9VAC25-115. The Board also authorized the staff to serve as hearing officer for the public hearing.

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MINUTE NO. 3 - Virginia Water Protection Permit Program Regulation Amendments

The Board was provided with the amendments to the Virginia Water Protection Permit Program Regulations 9VAC25-210, 9VAC25-660, 9VAC25-670, 9VAC25-680, and 9VAC25-690 to reissue the four VWP general permits; incorporate existing guidance and provisions that resulted from Virginia General Assembly actions; and to incorporate program-related federal regulatory actions over the last decade or more, including those related to surface water withdrawals. David Davis presented the background associated with the proposed action. Brenda Winn and Scott Kudlas summarized the technical amendments proposed related to: editorial revisions; organizational revisions; administrative continuance of issued permits; permitting exclusions; minor modifications to permits; informational requirements; compensatory mitigation; surface water withdrawal-specific definitions; and general permit terms and transition. Melanie Davenport, David Davis, and Scott Kudlas answered questions from the Board members. The Board suggested placing a time limit on how long an administrative continuance may last and also suggested that the public notice should emphasize the proposed amendments where the Citizen Advisory Group was unable to reach consensus.

The Attorney General's office provided concurrence that the agency has the statutory authority to implement the proposed amendments and also suggested several editorial revisions. These suggested revisions were incorporated into the proposed amendments as errata subsequent to the Board receiving the draft proposed amendments.

Based on the staff recommendation, the Board voted unanimously to approve noticing the proposed amendments to the Virginia Water Protection Permit Program Regulation 9VAC 25-210, as well as the amendments to and reissuance of the four general permit regulations 9VAC25-660, 9VAC25-670, 9VAC25-680, and 9VAC25-690, for public comment and hearing.

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MINUTE NO. 4 – Significant Noncompliance Report

Kathleen O'Connell, Water Enforcement Program Manager, informed the Board that one permittee was reported to EPA on the Quarterly Noncompliance Report as being in significant noncompliance for the quarter ending September 30, 2014. The permittee, the facility and the instances of noncompliance were reported as follows:

1. Invista S.à.r.l., Waynesboro Wastewater Treatment Plant, failure to meet Total Residual Chlorine permit effluent limit in April and September 2014.

Ms. O'Connell reported that enforcement action to address the reported noncompliance appeared unnecessary since investigation of the issue revealed that the effluent limit violations were in fact false positive lab results.

The Board accepted the report.
