Standardization of Preceptor Training

Project Proposal: State Preceptor Certification

Background

With the requirement in 2012 for EMS programs to maintain national accreditation, all Paramedic programs are required to verify that field preceptors have been trained. ODEMSA developed a preceptor training program locally that would be shared regionally among all ALS education programs and agencies. This collaboration was quite effective, and prompted the discussion of including organizations and programs outside the ODEMSA region. As such, the infrastructure for maintaining verification of a statewide program is already in place in Virginia. Similar to the OMD endorsement process, we would suggest the creation of an EMS Field Preceptor certification, managed by the Virginia Office of EMS.

Objectives

- To meet CoAEMSP/CAAHEP accreditation requirements for field preceptor training/verification
- To improve the consistency in didactic, laboratory, clinical and field education for EMS programs
- To centralize and standardize preceptor education across the Commonwealth of Virginia
- To provide additional professional development and potential "career ladder" opportunities, providing a credential that would be applicable to both student precepting and field training.

Scope

The project would require development of a committee to develop a curriculum for training, and establish statewide criteria for preceptor certifications, develop the media and presentation materials, and establish implementation procedures and timelines.

Timeframe

Monitoring and Evaluation

The program could potentially be provided through Train VA, webinars, or in person delivery by Education Coordinators who have attended the training. Criteria would need to be developed in committee as to who can teach the program. Certifications should be 3 years, with a required preceptor update for recertification.
