Regulations Governing the Practice of Physician Assistants

18VAC85-50-10 et seq.

I have reviewed the amendments to the *Regulations Governing the Practice of Doctors of Medicine, Osteopathic Medicine, Podiatry, and Chiropractic*, 18VAC85-20-10, *et seq.*, and the *Regulations Governing the Practice of Physician Assistants*, 18VAC85-50-10, *et seq.* The proposed regulations set forth requirements for doctors of medicine, doctors of osteopathic medicine, and physician assistants to practice laser hair removal and/or supervise laser hair removal by unlicensed, properly trained personnel. The Board of Medicine has the statutory authority to propose these regulations under Virginia Code §§ 54.1-2400(6) and 54.1-2973.1. The proposed regulations are constitutional and do not conflict with existing federal or state laws or regulations.
