The impactful costs and benefits are detailed below:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Fees for licensure: Initial application, which will apply to all practitioners since this is a new profession, will be \$125. Renewal will be \$80 biannually. - Benefits are employment as a licensed certified midwife and saving the licensure fee of an RN. The only other category of practitioner similar to a licensed certified midwife is a certified nurse midwife, who is an advanced practice registered nurse (APRN) under Virginia’s laws and must hold an APRN license (initial application \$125, biennial renewal \$80) and an RN license (initial application \$190, biennial renewal \$140). - Benefit is the expected median income, based on data on Certified Nurse Midwives, who have the same midwifery training, with the added savings of not paying for an RN license.
