Pursuant to the 2009 Acts of the Assembly (SB1282 – Chapter 687), the Board of Audiology and Speech-Language Pathology has amended its regulations relating to the responsibility of the licensee to provide current addresses. SB1282 requires that every licensee provide an address of record for use by the Board and the Department, but permits a person to provide a second address to be used as the public address. If a second address is not provided, the address of record becomes the public address. Regulations are amended to use the statutory terminology of address of record and to clarify that the regulant has a responsibility to notify the board if there is a change in the public address as well as the address of record (if there is a difference).

On October 8, 2009, the Board of Audiology and Speech-Language Pathology acted to amend its regulations in Chapter 20 *Regulations Governing the Practice of Audiology and Speech-Language Pathology* to conform requirements for providing a current address to changes in § 54.1-2400.02 of the Code of Virginia. The action is exempt in the Administrative Process Act under § 2.2-4006 of the Code of Virginia.
