CONSENT ORDER

Respondent Joann Hamilton, t/a C A Hamilton & Co ("Joann Hamilton") recognizes and acknowledges being subject to and bound by the Regulations of the Board for Contractors ("Board"), as well as by all other applicable Virginia laws

Board's Regulations provides:

18 VAC 50-22-200. Remedial education, revocation or suspension; fines.

The board may require remedial education, revoke or suspend a license or fine a licensee when a licensee has been found to have violated or cooperated with others in violating any provision of Chapter 11 (§ 54.1-1100 et seq.) of Title 54.1 of the Code of Virginia, or any regulation of the board.

On October 9, 2007, the Notice of Informal Fact-Finding Conference ("Notice") was mailed, via certified mail, to Joann Hamilton to the address of record. The Notice included the Report of Findings, which contained the facts regarding the regulatory and/or statutory issues in this matter. The certified mail was signed for and received.

On November 13, 2007, an Informal Fact-Finding Conference ("IFF") was convened at the Department of Professional and Occupational Regulation.

The following individuals participated at the IFF Hamilton on behalf of C A. Hamilton, Respondent; Doug Schroder and Jennifer Winters, Staff Members; and Dorothy Wood, Presiding Board Member.

The Report of Findings, which contains the facts regarding the regulatory and/or statutory issues in this matter, is incorporated with the Consent Order.

The Board and Joann Hamilton, as evidenced by the signatures affixed below, enter into this Consent Order. Joann Hamilton knowingly and voluntarily waives any further proceedings in this matter under Administrative Process Act §§2.2-4020 and 2.2-4021 of the 1950 Code of Virginia, as amended.

By signing this Consent Order, Joann Hamilton acknowledges an understanding of the charges and hereby admits to the violation(s) of the Counts as outlined in the Report of Findings. Joann Hamilton consents to the following term(s):

Further, for violation of Counts 1 and 2, Joann Hamilton agrees to have a member of the Responsible Management successfully complete a Board-approved remedial education class.

Any monetary penalties, costs, and/or sanctions are to be paid/performed within ninety days of the effective date of this consent order unless otherwise specifically noted above. Joann Hamilton acknowledges any monetary penalty and costs as a debt to the Commonwealth and agrees that in the event of a default, or the return of a check for insufficient funds, Joann Hamilton will be responsible for a penalty fee of 10% and interest at the underpayment rate prescribed in Section 58 1-15 of the 1950 Code of Virginia, as amended, and for all reasonable administrative costs, collection fees, or attorney's fees incurred in the collection of whatever funds are due.

Joann Hamilton acknowledges that failure to pay any monetary penalty or cost and/or to comply with all terms of this Order within the specified time period, shall result in the automatic suspension of Joann Hamilton's license until such time as there is compliance with all terms of this Order. Joann Hamilton understands the right to have this automatic suspension considered in an IFF pursuant to the Administrative Process Act §§2.2-4019 and 2.2-4021 of the 1950 Code of Virginia, as amended, but knowingly and voluntarily waives any rights to the proceeding and hereby waives any further proceedings under the Administrative Process Act §§2.2-4020 and 2.2-4021 of the 1950 Code of Virginia, as amended.

The effective date of this Order shall be the date of execution by the Board.

COMMENTS:

Respondent provided a copy of a revised contract form, therefore a charge for failing to include minimum provisions in the contract was not pursued.

Joann Hamilton ("Hamilton"), t/a C.A. Hamilton & Co., was at all times material to this matter a licensed Class C contractor in Virginia (No. 2705103332).

Based on the analysis and/or investigation of this matter, there is probable cause to believe the respondent has committed the following violation(s) of the Code of Virginia and/or Board's regulation(s):

BACKGROUND:

On January 31, 2007, the Compliance & Investigations Division of the Department of Professional and Occupational Regulation received a written complaint from Jose A Nazario and Emily Nazario ("the Nazarios") regarding Hamilton. (Exh. C-1)

On October 13, 2006, Hamilton presented a written estimate ("contract"), in the amount of \$3,700.00, to the Nazarios, to construct a concrete driveway extension and a basketball court at 730 Harpersville Road, Newport News, Virginia. The Nazarios verbally agreed to the contract (Exh. C-2 and I-1)

On October 17, 2006, the Nazarios paid Hamilton \$2,500.00 by two check payments with the balance of \$1,200.00 to be paid upon completion of the contracted work. (Exh. C-3 and I-1)

On October 20, 2006, Hamilton commenced work. (Exh. I-1)

1. Board Regulation

18 VAC 50-22-260. Filing of charges; prohibited acts

B. The following are prohibited acts.

8. Failure of all those who engage in residential contracting, excluding subcontractors to the contracting parties and those who engage in routine maintenance or service contracts, to make use of a legible written contract clearly specifying the terms and conditions of the work to be performed. For the purposes of this chapter, residential contracting means construction, removal, repair, or improvements to single-family or multiple-family residential buildings, including accessory-use structures as defined in § 54.1-1100 of the Code of Virginia. Prior to commencement of work or acceptance of payments, the contract shall be signed by both the consumer and the licensee or his agent.

FACTS:

The contract was not signed by either Hamilton or the Nazarios. (Exh. C-2)

In a written response dated March 29, 2007, Hamilton alleged that her husband signed the contract and that Emily Nazario also signed the contract and told Hamilton's husband she would fax it to Hamilton's office (Exh R-1) The Nazarios deny this. (Exh. I-1)

2 Board Regulation

18 VAC 50-22-260. Filing of charges; prohibited acts.

B. The following are prohibited acts:

15. The intentional and unjustified failure to complete work contracted for and/or to comply with the terms in the contract.

Print Date February 1, 2006

FACTS:

The agreement specified the following contracted work specifications:

- Move existing gate at end of driveway.
- Extend existing driveway 25' long and 12' wide, level ground and finish with concrete
- Install a new gate at the end of the new driveway
- Basketball Court: Level ground where needed.
- Install concrete basketball court (25' x 30') in backyard.
- Labor and Materials Included (no landscaping included). (Exh. C-2)

The last day Hamilton performed work at the subject property was October 30, 2006. (Exh. I-1)

Between November 1, 2006, and the first week of December 2006, the Nazarios telephoned Hamilton several times requesting completion of the contracted work. Hamilton told them she would not perform the work until the balance of \$1,200.00 was paid. (Exh. I-1)

In a written response dated March 29, 2007, Hamilton stated that because of personal problems the company was unable to complete the contracted work without charging additional costs. (Exh. R-1)

On April 17, 2007, Hamilton presented a written contract, in the amount of \$2,600 00, to the Nazarios to complete the contracted work, increasing the total cost of the project by \$1,400 00. The Nazarios rejected the offer. (Exh. R-2, I-2, and I-3)

As of May 2, 2007, Hamilton failed to complete the following contracted work specified in the agreement:

- Driveway extension, level ground, and finish with concrete.
- Level ground for basketball court (Exh I-1 and I-3)




