The proposed regulations and standards would manage the location, number, spacing and design of commercial entrances, intersections, median openings, turn lanes, and traffic signals on VDOT maintained minor arterials, collectors, and local streets while respecting property owners' rights to reasonable access to the highways. Carefully controlling where vehicles can turn to and from the highway can reduce traffic delays/congestion which supports economic productivity, fuel economy, and clean air. It can help lower the number of crashes and resulting fatalities and injuries. Critical highway capacity also can be preserved by reducing the need for new or wider highways.
