## Notice of Intended Regulatory Action Agency Background Document

### Purpose

*The goal of the Home Energy Assistance Program is to assist low-income Virginians in meeting their residential energy needs and to support the efforts of public agencies, private utility service providers, and charitable and community groups seeking to assist low-income Virginians in meeting their residential energy needs.*

The purpose of this action is to promulgate a permanent regulation to replace the emergency regulation that established the Home Energy Assistance Program and the Home Energy Assistance Fund, HB 2473, enacted by the 2001 Virginia General Assembly.

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Pursuant to §63.1-25 of the Code of Virginia (<http://leg1.state.va.us/cgi-bin/legp504.exe?000+cod+63.1-25>), the State Board of Social Services has authority to promulgate rules and regulations necessary for operation of all assistance programs. The Home Energy Assistance Program is mandated Virginia statutory law, HB 2473, enacted by the 2001 Virginia General Assembly.

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The planned regulation establishes the Home Energy Assistance Program and the Home Energy Assistance Fund; authorizes the Department of Social Services to receive and disburse monies from the Fund; provides a financial resource for low-income families having difficulty meeting their home energy costs; and provides an opportunity for coordinated efforts between public agencies, private utility service providers, and charitable and community groups seeking to assist low-income families with their home energy needs.

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There are no alternatives. This regulatory action is required by 63.1-341 Code of Virginia.

### Family Impact Statement

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The planned regulation has a positive impact on the family.
