The 1997 General Assembly of Virginia revised and re-codified laws pertaining to counties, cities and towns. Consequently, Section 15.1-11.6 became Section 15.2-910. This Code section is the mandate for 16 VAC 25-40-10 et seq. This action corrects Code of Virginia references to the enabling statute throughout the regulation.

Family impact

The technical change is for correction only and the regulation has a positive impact on the institution of the family and family stability by protecting families from the operation of boiler and pressure vessels in an unsafe manner.

No public comments were received on this regulation during the public comment period which began May 3, 2004. The agency and the Safety and Health Codes Board did not establish and informal advisory group for the purpose of assisting in the periodic review.

Section 15.1-11.6 (changed to 15.2-910) of the Code of Virginia authorizes a local government, at its option to require boiler or pressure vessel operators to obtain an initial certification from the locality before engaging in the operation and maintenance of boilers and pressure vessels in that jurisdiction. This regulation provides a uniform statewide standard to determine ability, proficiency and qualification of local certification applicants. This standard is for governing bodies of counties, cities, and towns that have adopted ordinances requiring local certification. This regulation does not provide for state certification of boiler and pressure vessel operators.

The regulation has two goals:

- 1. To insure statewide uniformity in the determination of the ability, proficiency and qualifications of boiler and pressure operators certified under a local government ordinance.
- 2. The protection of the public's health, safety and welfare with the least possible cost and intrusiveness to the citizens and businesses of the Commonwealth.

The regulation achieves these goals by providing uniform statewide criteria to be used by all counties, cities or towns who choose to regulate the certification of boiler and pressure vessel operators. It protects the citizens of the Commonwealth from the dangers of boiler or pressure vessels being operated in an unsafe manner or by an unqualified operator. The regulation has a positive impact on the institution of the family and family stability by protecting families from the operation of boiler and pressure vessels in an unsafe manner. The regulation is clearly written and easily understandable.

To comply with the Code of Virginia mandate the Department of Labor and Industry and the Safety and Health Codes Board recommend retaining the regulation with the technical changes to the Code references only. This regulation provides protection of the public's health, safety and welfare with the least possible cost and intrusiveness to the citizens and businesses of the Commonwealth. To date, no locality has adopted an ordinance which requires certification of boiler and pressure vessel operators under Section 15.2-910.
