Code of Virginia § 2.2-4007.02 gives authority to each agency pursuant to the provisions of this chapter (Code of Virginia, Title 2.2), which includes the Board for Waterworks and Wastewater Works Operators and Onsite Sewage System Professionals (Board), to promote public involvement in the development, amendment, or repeal of any agency's regulations by soliciting the input of interested parties. This is done through the adoption of Public Participation Guidelines and the use of the guidelines in the development of the Board's regulations.

Code of Virginia § 2.2-4007.02 mandates the Board to solicit the input of interested parties in the formation and development of its regulations. Therefore, the continued need for the regulation is established in statute. The regulation is necessary to protect public health, safety and welfare by establishing Public Participation Guidelines which promote public involvement in the development, amendment, or repeal of an agency's regulation. By soliciting the input of interested parties, the Board is better equipped to ensure individuals licensed as waterworks operators, wastewater works operators, onsite soil evaluators, onsite sewage system installers, and onsite sewage system operators in Virginia have met minimum competencies. Since no complaints or comments were received during the public comment period, there does not appear to be a reason to amend or repeal the regulation. The regulation is clearly written and easily understandable. The regulation does not overlap, duplicate or conflict with federal or state law or regulation. The most recent periodic review of the regulation occurred in 2008 which resulted in the repeal of 18 VAC 160-10, the existing Public Participation Guidelines at that time, and adoption of 18 VAC 160-11, Model Public Participation Guidelines. The Board discussed the regulation and, for the reasons stated in this section, determined that the regulation should not be amended or repealed, but should be retained in its current form.
