Section 3.2-109 of the Code of Virginia establishes the Board of Agriculture and Consumer Services (Board) as a policy board. Sections 3.2-4601 and 3.2-4605 of the Code of Virginia authorize the Board to adopt regulations to prescribe certain requirements related to controlled atmosphere storage of apples and to prescribe certain fees for operators of controlled atmosphere storage, respectively.

The agency considered repealing the regulation. However, the regulation is needed to clarify certain provisions of the Code of Virginia pertaining to controlled atmosphere storage of apples. The agency believes the present version is the least burdensome and least intrusive alternative. For these reasons, the agency decided to retain the regulation.

The agency has determined that no changes have occurred in the area affected by this regulation since the last periodic review that would make it necessary to amend or repeal the regulation. The agency believes the current version of the regulation is the least burdensome and least intrusive alternative for the apple industry and affected small businesses.
