My wife is a licensed master esthetician in Virginia (Sarah Akram - license #1264000712.) I am writing to voi on he behalf to consider a regulatory change with respect to an Esthetics service she would like to offer (Miscounicular) which, under current VA licensing regulations; is outside the scope of a Master Esthetics license (as micropuncturing is akin to microneedling based on VA Interpretation of what license is required to perform certain procedures under Code of Virginia §54.1-700 et. seq., re: Eyelash Extensions, Microblading, Microneedling, Chemical Exiderion.

Under current FDA regulations issued in 2015 - microneedling devices with needles longer than .3mm must be classified as a Class 1 medical device. Under those same FDA guidelines, estheticians can only use microneedling devices of less than .3mm and only those that do not make medical claims. I am humbly asking the board to consider conforming its stance on microneedling to those of the FDA (i.e. either master estheticians or estheticians can only use microneedling devices of less than .3mm) as the service is NOT medical in nature, is not marketed as such and is purely used for Esthetics purposes. Esthetics purposes.

I attach an example of such a device and it clearly is not marketed nor included for medical use. Thank you for your attention to this matter. Do not hesitate to call or email me with any possitions.




- 1. Protect the barber and protect the client from skin disorders by avoiding 100% contact with an individual's skin.
