Mr. Quesenberry, Chair, determined a quorum was present and called Call to Order the meeting to order at 9:10 a.m.

MaryJane Masssad Hogue, of Richmond, Virginia addressed the Board on behalf of Ms. Sara Nguyen. Ms. Hogue stated that Ms. Nguyen is a United States citizen; however, her native language is Chinese and English is her second language. Ms. Hogue stated that Ms. Nguyen graduated from cosmetology school and has been an apprentice for 7 1/2 years and is a master colorist.

Ms. Hogue stated that Ms. Nguyen has had difficulty on the exam and in China Ms. Nguyen may have been considered as having dyslexia if such diagnosis were available in China.

Ms. Hogue stated that Ms. Nguyen would pay for reasonable options and that Ms. Nguyen received her Virginia Driver's license with accommodations for those who do not read English well.

Ms. Hogue asked the Board for leadership, guidance, and alternatives to assist Ms. Nguyen in obtaining her cosmetologist license.

Maryanne Kaminsky, of Richmond, Virginia, with In Plain English, LLC, also addressed the Board on behalf of Ms. Sara Nguyen. Ms. Kaminsky stated she is a speech pathologist and assist those with language disorders, English as a second language, and those individuals who wish to reduce their accent.

Ms. Kaminsky stated she has known Ms. Nguyen for many years and is confident in her skills as a hair dresser. Ms. Kaminsky stated she did a review of various states in particular California and New York since these states are known for their large immigrant population. These states do provide accommodations such as translators with rigid rules attached to this service.

Ms. Kaminsky stated Ms. Nguyen has reviewed sample test and Ms. Nguyen does well with hair, scalp, skin, but has difficulty with chemistry. Ms. Kaminsky stated that persons who learn English as a second language come in with their own grammar and English is a difficult language to learn because of its subtleties.

Ms. Kaminsky stated that Ms. Nguyen did pass her citizenship examination and that Ms. Nguyen has good professional cosmetology skills and someone she is proud of.

Beverly Connor, of West Point, Virginia addressed the Board. Ms. Connor stated she is a Cosmetology Instructor at the Henrico Regional Jail East located in New Kent County. Ms. Connor thanked the Board for its diligence, attentiveness, the opportunity for their students to practice in field of cosmetology and giving them a second change to make a positive impact. Ms. Connor stated that the students work hard to enroll in the program, maintain, and ultimately graduate and pass the state board exam. Ms. Connor reiterated her appreciation to the Board and commended the Board on their commitment to the industry and to the public.
