Mr. Haughwout provided an overview of DPOR's new licensing and enforcement software, EPICx, including software capabilities and the project timeline for release. Mr. Haughwout also provided an update on legislation from the 2024 General Assembly session, including agency bills as well as bills that affect DPOR regulants.

Update on Department Operations



September 16, 2024



DPOR has worked to implement Universal License Recognition (ULR), which became effective on July 1, 2023.

As of 9/11/24, DPOR has issued the following under ULR:

- 571 Total Licenses or Certifications for 38 Different Types, including
 - 149 Tradesman licenses
 - 106 Cosmetology and Barber licenses
 - 133 Real Estate Salesperson and Broker licenses
 - 33 Waterworks and Wastewater Works Operator licenses



DPOR has worked to improve processing time of applications for licenses and certifications; reduce delays and backlogs.

Average processing time from application receipt to issuing of license.

• 2021: 33 days

• 2022: 14 days

• 2023: 10 days

• 2024: 5.3 days

Status of Regulatory Reviews

- 33 Chapters of Regulations
 - 32 currently under Executive Directive 1 Review
 - 1 chapter review action finalized.
 - 32 comprehensive review/reduction actions underway
- 59 Pending Regulatory Actions on Town Hall (as of 9/3/24)
 - 33 Actions directly from Executive Directive 1
 - 7 Exempt Actions resulting from 2024 legislative changes
 - 4 Fee Actions (Review required every 2 years)
- 17% of all regulatory actions across the state are DPOR actions (out of 100 state agencies).



Compliance and Investigations

Other Activities

- Replaced two section managers due to retirements.
- Two sections –Investigations (CAR) and Common Interest Community Ombudsman (CICO) are moving to become near paperless.
- All teams are ramping up efforts with EPICx to prepare and implement the enforcement module.



Information Systems

- DPOR signed a Statement of Work (SOW) on November 14, 2023, with Tyler Technologies to replace DPOR's aging licensing and enforcement systems.
- This initiative, called EPICx (Efficient Processing, Intuitive Customer Experience) will streamline the agency's processes with the goal of more efficient license and complaint processing.
- EPICx implementation will provide digital licenses and certificates, eliminating the need to send in paper forms and applications. Customers will have the ability to complete applications online, view education requirements, update information, and access license and certification documentation.

2024 General Assembly Session

Legislative Implementation

- -16 bills (3 agency bills)
- Legislation took effect July 1, 2024
- -Each board section has communicated changes to regulants



2024 General Assembly Session Agency Bills

• HB 350 (Owen)

— A bill to adjust the quorum requirements for the Board for Architects, Professional Engineers, Land Surveyors, Certified Interior Designers, and Landscape Architects. The legislation lowers the current quorum from two engineers, two architects, and two land surveyors to a minimum of one engineer, one architect, and one land surveyor. Additionally, the bill removes the requirement that licenses issued by the Board must be signed by at least four members. This bill is set to expire on July 1, 2026.

HB 1005 (Owen)/SB 560 (Hackworth)

A bill to remove the responsibility of the Board for Asbestos, Lead, and Home Inspectors to promulgate regulations concerning dust sampling technicians, renovators, and accredited renovation training programs (RRP Program).
 This change aims to streamline the Board's regulatory duties and refocus its efforts on other priorities.

• HB 1182 (Ennis)

— A bill to make changes to the certification requirements for Virginia's voluntary Professional Wetland Delineation Certification to align the statute with the Universal License Recognition (ULR) statute. The legislation reduces the experience requirement for professional wetland delineator certification from four years to three years for applicants with a relevant bachelor's degree or relevant experience in wetland science research or teaching at an accredited institution.

- HB 1190 (Thomas) Contractors, Board for; offering exams, language counterparts.***
- HB 576 (Glass) and SB 313 (VanValkenburg) Contractors, Board for; required regulations and disclosures.***



Unknown Unknowns

- De-Centralized Regulatory Development
 - Five board sections with separate approach to regulatory development.
 - Little coordination or uniformity; inconsistent compliance with APA.
- Unknown universe of regulatory requirements
 - 2018–2021 Regulatory Reduction Pilot: 2,730 requirements.
 - DPOR credited with 26+% reduction; but reported 2,691 requirements.
 - Methodology unknown to program staff; opaque process.
- Regulatory Reduction Initiative
 - Standardized Framework and Counting Methodology
 - 18,900+ requirements
