

Purpose of the meeting

Since 2015, DBHDS has used the Supports Intensity Scale® (SIS)® assessment to determine rates for specific services. The SIS assessment is changing and DBHDS has a project to update this model. DBHDS wants to hear from people receiving services and other interested people. DBHDS is working with an advisory group to support this project. The public is welcome to listen in on this advisory group meeting.

- We haven't finalized our recommendations, transition plan, or communications plan
- As we finalize these we may add to or alter what we share today


Implementation

- Implementation of the SIS-A[®] 2nd Edition is tentatively scheduled to begin October 1, 2024
- After the SIS-A[®] 2nd Edition is implemented, it will take about four years for everyone to get assessed and receive a new support level and/or rate tier, as applicable
- Until October 1, 2024, people will continue to participate in the SIS as scheduled and will not be reassessed until their next assessment is due or they qualify for a reassessment

Proposed Support Levels/Rate Tiers

- We propose moving from 7 support levels to 6 support levels
- We propose using all sections and subsections of the SIS to assign support levels/rate tiers
- We propose keeping the crosswalk from support levels and rate tiers the same
- This proposal will increase costs for some waiver services

Preliminary Support Levels



- 1** Low general support need, no extraordinary medical or behavioral needs
- 2** Moderate general support need, no extraordinary medical or behavioral needs
- 3** High general support need, no extraordinary medical or behavioral needs
- 4** Very high general support need, no extraordinary medical or behavioral needs
- M** Extraordinary medical support need
- B** Extraordinary behavioral support need

Preliminary Rate Tiers

| Tier | Current Support Level | Proposed Support Level | Support Level Descriptions |
|------|-----------------------|------------------------|--|
| 1 | 1 | 1 | Low general support need, no extraordinary medical or behavioral needs |
| 2 | 2 | 2 | Moderate general support need, no extraordinary medical or behavioral needs |
| 3 | 4 | 3 | High general support need, no extraordinary medical or behavioral needs |
| 4 | 5 | 4 | Very high general support need, no extraordinary medical or behavioral needs |
| 4 | 6 | M | Extraordinary medical support need |
| 4 | 7 | B | Extraordinary behavioral support need |

*Support Level 3 will not be included in proposed support levels

Assessment

Scheduling Assessments

- Assess same approximate number of people per year

Assessment Process

- Convey expectations for people and families to speak up
- Encourage people who know the person best to attend

Supplemental Questions

- Reduce and simplify SQs
- Strengthen document review verification

Using the SIS

- Monitor Risk Assessment Tool (RAT) alignment with SIS
- Integrate SIS into Person-Centered Plan

System Analysis and Evaluation

System Analysis

- Track system metrics
- Track implementation
- Use support levels/rate tiers to track specific initiatives or requirements

Evaluation

- Consider ongoing evaluation
- Time evaluation with other efforts

Not Recommending Changes To:

- Current children's support levels
- Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) for the SIS
- SIS reassessment request process (except to ensure that reassessments are sought when there are changes noted in the RAT)
- Customized rate process



Transition Plan

Implementing Proposed Changes

Implementing Support Levels

- Update support levels in all systems
- Integrate support levels/rate tiers into existing systems

Test Support Levels

- Test initially and conduct routine quality checks

Secure Funding

- Ensuring that funding is available to implement over 4 years

Policy

Administrative Codes

- 12VAC30-122-200 and 12VAC30-122-210 need to be updated
- Use Medicaid Memo to outline changes

Waivers

- References to 7 support levels in Building Independence, Community Living, and Family and Individual Support Waivers will need to be updated



Communications

Communication

Communicating Changes

- General communications outlining changes
- Plain language and simple
- Should outline why, benefits/risks, and provide context

Changing Support Levels

- Information explaining support level/tier crosswalk

Education

People and Families

- Continue education about the support levels/rate tiers
- Set expectations for SIS
- Clear avenues for communication

CSBs, Providers, DBDHS

- Share update in quarterly CSB training
- New provider training, optional ongoing training, and updates
- Dedicated education to workgroups


