Licensee's, Building Officials, Contract Administrators, and consumers are confused with regards to whether or not contractors holding the HIC specialty may perform minor trade-related repairs associated with the renovation/improvement that they have been contracted to perform.

Board Policies and Procedures

Mr. Olson provided the Board with a report of the National Association of State Contractor Licensing Agencies (NASCLA) National Conference, which was held in Nashville this past August. Information regarding the status of regulations, enforcement activity, statutory concerns, regulatory board issues, and exam security were discussed. A formal written report will be provided to the Board at the next meeting.

NASCLA Conference Report

Mr. Olson provided the Board with an update on the status of pending regulatory actions. The Contractor PPG regulations and the proposed regulations adding the miscellaneous specialty are both awaiting the approval of the Governor.

Mr. Redifer shared that the amendments to the USBC became effective on 9/4/18. These amendments included the updating of the NEC to the 2014 edition and the other trade-related codes to the 2015 edition. After discussion the board voted unanimously to accept the 2015 Code to meet the continuing education requirements for HVAC, Plumbing, Gas Fitters, and the 2014 NEC to meet the continuing education requirements for electricians. Those voting yes were: Bynum-Coleman, Dyer, Hux, Johnson, Magruder, Middleton, Oliver, Redifer, Tomlin, and Trenary. Ayres, Pace, O'Dell, Mitchell, Dowdy and Giesen were absent.
