Marjorie King, Executive Director, informed the Committee: Remote proctoring of examinations has gone live. Ms. King also noted that the Board has been asked to complete a review of its examination questions for all the classifications, specialties, business law exams, and the pass rates by the end of the year.

EpicX

EpicX

Marjorie King, Executive Director, informed the Committee: DPOR is thrilled to announce the launch of its new system implementation. DPOR's new cloud-hosted, integrated licensing and case management solution, EPICx (Efficient Processing Intuitive Customer Experience). This upgrade will modernize operations, providing greater efficiency and enhance public access.

The project will be rolled out in two waves:

Wave 1 (March 2025): Compliance and Investigation Division, Real Estate Board, Fair Housing Board, Real Estate Appraiser Board, Cemetery Board, Barbers and Cosmetology Board, and Board for Hearing

Aid Specialists and Opticians.

Wave 2 (December 2025): Remaining divisions and boards, including Contractors.

This new system will replace our outdated EAGLES, ETS, and IRIS systems, offering a unified platform for licensing, enforcement, and document management.

It will streamline processes, improve service delivery, and allow citizens to apply, renew, and make payments online.

Key Benefits:

Consolidation: One integrated database for all functions.

Enhanced Access: Expanded online services for the public.

Efficiency: Streamlined licensing and enforcement processes.

Staff looks forward to sharing more details and working to make this transition smooth and successful. The support and collaboration of board members are crucial as DPOR moves towards this exciting new chapter.


Adjournment
