### **Brief Summary**

There is significant non-potable groundwater use from the confined aquifer system for agricultural activities such as irrigation and cooling for poultry houses. Various parties on the Eastern Shore, including the Eastern Shore Groundwater Committee propose that use of the surficial aquifer or water table aquifer for non-potable uses achieves greater long-term aquifer sustainability. This regulatory proposal will amend the existing groundwater withdrawal regulation to authorize the development of a general permit and create a new general permit regulation to promote use of the surficial aquifer on the Eastern Shore.

This regulatory action is in response to the directive created by Chapter 755 of the 2019 Acts of Assembly that requires the Board to adopt regulations to provide incentives for the withdrawal of ground water from the surficial aquifer in the Eastern Shore Groundwater Management Area rather than from the deep aquifer in such management area.

The purpose of these regulatory actions is to provide incentives for the use of the surficial aquifer on the Eastern Shore for non-potable purpose through the creation of a general permit. The adoption of a general permit protects the health, safety or welfare of citizens by providing incentives for non-potable water needs to be met by the surficial aquifer, thus conserving groundwater in the lower aquifers for potable needs.

#### Substance

Amendments to the Groundwater Withdrawal Regulations will establish the framework for the issuance of a general permit under the Groundwater Withdrawal Regulation. The new general permit regulation will include the establishment of permit terms, withdrawal limitations, and reporting requirements necessary to permit withdrawals.

One alternative to the regulatory action is to not initiate a rulemaking to adopt a general permit. This alternative was rejected as the Board has been directed to adopt regulations to provide incentives for the use of the surficial aquifer on the Eastern Shore. Specific incentives that will be considered include extended permit terms of as long as 20 years, discounted permit fees, other subsidies or incentives that may be suggested by interested persons. t
