Chapter 750 of the 2018 Acts of Assembly directs the Board for Contractors to amend its regulations to extend the license period for individuals licensed as tradesmen from two years to three years.

Because all types of licenses and certifications issued by the Board currently renew on a two-year cycle, 18 VAC 50-30-120 is amended to distinguish tradesmen licenses (i.e., electricians, gas fitters, HVAC, and plumbers) from other categories of individual credentials (e.g., liquefied petroleum gas fitters, elevator mechanics, water well system providers, etc.).

Once segregated, language is added to provide that tradesmen licenses are valid for three years, and renewal fees for tradesmen are adjusted to align with the longer license term—the current two-year \$130 renewal fee on an annualized basis is \$65, so for a three-year term the renewal fee would be \$195.

The reinstatement fee is similarly adjusted by amending 18 VAC 50-30-130 to take into account the extended license period for tradesmen. For clarity, the gas fitter trade specialty (which falls under tradesmen licensure usually as a division within HVAC or plumbing) is also delineated in this section in order to ensure that it is not confused with the Natural Gas Fitter Provider and the Liquefied Petroleum Gas Fitter credentials, both of which are separate individual license programs established pursuant to Va. Code § 54.1-1129.
