The purpose of the final action is to implement the provisions of Chapter 811 of the 2018 Acts of Assembly, which authorizes historical horse racing at facilities licensed by the Virginia Racing Commission. The proposed regulations will address the requirements for an entity licensed to conduct pari-mutuel wagering on historical horse racing, including (i) the location and hours of operation, (ii) types and specifications of the terminals to be utilized, (iii) accounting and auditing, (iv) permits required for licensee employees, (v) simulcast operations, (vi) annual reporting, and (vii) implementation by a licensee of a program to promote responsible gaming and the program's minimum requirements.

On June 25, 2020, the Virginia Racing Commission adopted the final amendments to Chapter 47 (Historical Horse Racing) at its regular monthly meeting.
