The regulations describe the responsibility of owners and operators of establishments and public places, throughout the Commonwealth, to place and maintain receptacles for receiving litter. The regulations establish which places must be provided with litter receptacles, the

standards for the receptacles, and the requirements for removal of the litter from the receptacles.

During the codification process resulting in the Virginia Administrative Code, these regulations was inadvertently left out. Chapter 14, Title 10.1, Section 10.1-1419 of the Code of Virginia requires that these regulations be promulgated. They were regulations of the Department of Conservation and Economic Development, Division of Litter Control and have been transferred to the Virginia Waste Management Board. This action will reestablish the same requirements.
