Chapter 557 of the Acts of the 2009 General Assembly, which was the result of SB 1143, amended, among other sections, §54.1-2351.H. This amendment changed the Board's authority to assess a monetary penalty of "not more than \$1,000 per violation against any person that violates any provision of this section [emphasis added]" to "not more than \$1,000 per violation against any governing board that violates any provision of this section [emphasis added]." This amendment caused this section to no longer be applicable to common interest community managers, thus the reference to § 54.1-2351.H in the Board's Common Interest Community Manager regulations that provides the grounds for disciplinary action imposed by the Board must be amended to reference § 54.1-202 of the Code of Virginia as it is applicable to "any person licensed or certified by a regulatory board who violates any statute or regulations pertaining to that regulatory board who is not criminally prosecuted."
