The Board is announcing a periodic review of 18VAC65-20, with resulting amendments to be made during this action. A committee of the Board will review the regulatory chapters listed and propose necessary amendments to enhance the regulation of the profession and protection of the public. Areas of interest to the Board include elimination of unnecessary or outdated language, reduction of barriers to licensure, updating continuing education language and the process for approving providers, and enhancement of public protection.

The purpose of this action is to conduct the required periodic review of regulations every four years. The changes the Board identifies will enhance the regulation of the profession and help ensure the protection of the public.

During the periodic review, the Board will review the identified regulatory chapters and identify necessary changes, to possibly include:

- Elimination of unnecessary or superfluous language or requirements; and
- Addition of requirements to better regulate the profession.
