18VAC85-20-10 et seq.

I have reviewed the proposed amendment to the Regulations Governing the Practice of Medicine, Osteopathic Medicine, Podiatry and Chiropractic, 18VAC85-20-10 *et seq*. The proposed amendment eliminates pharmacists as practitioners that may perform a second check of mixed, diluted, or reconstituted drugs where such mixing, diluting, or reconstituting is performed in a physician's office under an exemption in the Drug Control Act, Virginia Code § 54.1-3400 *et seq*., to requirements for compounding medications. The Board has the statutory authority to amend these regulations under Virginia Code § 54.1-2400(6). The proposed amendment is constitutional and does not conflict with existing federal or state laws or regulations.
