On September 19, 2017, the Board of Nursing amended 18VAC90-27, Regulations Governing Nursing Education Programs.

Regulations are promulgated under the general authority of Chapter 24 of Title 54.1 of the Code of Virginia. Section 54.1-2400 (6), which provides the Board of Nursing the authority to promulgate regulations to administer the regulatory system:

§ 54.1-2400 -General powers and duties of health regulatory boards

The general powers and duties of health regulatory boards shall be:

- 1. To establish the qualifications for registration, certification, licensure or the issuance of a multistate licensure privilege in accordance with the applicable law which are necessary to ensure competence and integrity to engage in the regulated professions.
- 2. To examine or cause to be examined applicants for certification or licensure. Unless otherwise required by law, examinations shall be administered in writing or shall be a demonstration of manual skills.
- 3. To register, certify, license or issue a multistate licensure privilege to qualified applicants as practitioners of the particular profession or professions regulated by such board.
- 4. To establish schedules for renewals of registration, certification, licensure, and the issuance of a multistate licensure privilege.
- 5. To levy and collect fees for application processing, examination, registration, certification or licensure or the issuance of a multistate licensure privilege and renewal that are sufficient to

cover all expenses for the administration and operation of the Department of Health Professions, the Board of Health Professions and the health regulatory boards.

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6. To promulgate regulations in accordance with the Administrative Process Act (§ 2.2-4000 et seq.) which are reasonable and necessary to administer effectively the regulatory system. Such regulations shall not conflict with the purposes and intent of this chapter or of Chapter 1 (§ 54.1-100 et seq.) and Chapter 25 (§ 54.1-2500 et seq.) of this title. ...

In addition, there is statutory authority for the board to approve nursing education programs:

- § 54.1-3005. Specific powers and duties of Board. In addition to the general powers and duties conferred in this title, the Board shall have the following specific powers and duties:
- 1. To prescribe minimum standards and approve curricula for educational programs preparing persons for licensure or certification under this chapter;
- 2. To approve programs that meet the requirements of this chapter and of the Board;
- 3. To provide consultation service for educational programs as requested;
- 4. To provide for periodic surveys of educational programs;
- 5. To deny or withdraw approval from educational programs for failure to meet prescribed standards; ...
- 9. To approve programs that entitle professional nurses to be registered as clinical nurse specialists and to prescribe minimum standards for such programs;...

Purpose

Hospitals and clinics that serve as settings for clinical training are better assured of the safety and welfare of their patients by having a more recent criminal background check rather than relying on the initial check at the time of a student's application to nursing school. There may be as much as a two-year gap from the time an applicant to nursing school has a background check and the time he/she begins a clinical experience involving direct patient care. By requiring a background check prior to the clinical experience rather than prior to admission, any prior or subsequent criminal activity will be known and there is more protection for patient health and safety.

Rationale for using fast-track process

The action is intended to clarify the term "full approval" and to address the gap of time between the criminal background check conducted at the time of admission to a nursing education program and the time a student would begin his/her clinical experience. The action was recommended by the Nursing Education Informal Conference Committee and unanimously approved by the Board. It is beneficial to students, nursing programs, and clinical settings, so it should not be controversial.

The Board has amended Chapter 27 to add a definition in section 10 for "full approval" of a nursing education program and to change the timing of a criminal background check for nursing students in section 70 from requiring the check prior to admission to prior to the clinical experience involving direct patient care.

- 1) The primary advantage of the amendment is better assurance that nursing students providing direct patient care have had a recent criminal background check. There are no disadvantages.
- 2) There are no advantages or disadvantages to the Commonwealth.
- 3) The Director of the Department of Health Professions has reviewed the proposal and performed a competitive impact analysis. The Board is authorized under § 54.1-2400 to "promulgate regulations in accordance with the Administrative Process Act (§2.2-4000 et seq.) which are reasonable and necessary to administer effectively the regulatory system." The Board does not have an estimate of the number of students affected. There are currently 138 programs approved by the Board to provide education for practical and professional nursing.

There are no additional costs for students or the education programs, since the background check is a current requirement. The timing of the check is the issue addressed.
Beneficial impact the regulation is designed to produce.	It should result in less cost to nursing students as they would only be required to obtain one criminal background check. Hospitals and clinics that serve as settings for clinical training are better assured of the safety of their patients by having a more recent background check rather than relying on the initial check at the time of application to nursing school.

There are no alternatives to amended regulations. The amendments are intended to clarify the current regulations or to address an issue identified with the timing of a criminal background check for nursing students.

10	Sets out definitions for words and terms used in the chapter	A definition for "full approval" is added to mean that compliance with regulations pertaining to nursing education programs has been verified. The term is used in sections 150 and 160, so a definition is included to clarify the meaning.
70	Sets out the requirements for admission of students in a nursing education program	Subsection D is amended to change the requirement for a criminal background check. Currently, applicants (except for high school students in practical nursing programs) are required to submit to a criminal background check prior to admission. The language is changed to require the check for students enrolled in a program prior to a clinical experience involving direct patient care. Hospitals and clinics where students are engaged in a clinical experience require a criminal background check prior to providing direct patient care. Typically, there is a gap of months or even years between the time a check was submitted prior to admission and the time of the clinical experience. Therefore, the clinical settings often require a second check to ensure that there has not been any criminal activity during that gap period.

The primary purpose of a background check is patient safety, so the timing before the clinical experience is beneficial and more logical. The action would save nursing students and programs the expense and effort of two background checks for the same purpose.
Included in the information a nursing education program is required to publish and distribute to applicants is "Information about implications of criminal convictions," so applicants who have criminal convictions know prior to enrollment and payment of tuition fees how those convictions may affect their ability to complete the program or the potential impact on employment.
