Purpose

The Board intends to consider amendments to requirements for continuing education for those persons licensed as social workers. Both licensed social workers and licensed clinical social workers are required to complete a minimum of 30 contact hours of continuing education for each biennial licensure renewal. Licensed social workers do case work and licensed clinical social workers practice independently, so the work functions and skill levels are different. Therefore, the Board will consider a reduction in the hours of continuing education required for licensed social workers.

Regulations are promulgated under the general authority of Chapter 24 of Title 54.1 of the Code of Virginia. Section 54.1-2400, which provides the Board of Social Work the authority to promulgate regulations to administer the regulatory system:

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§ 54.1-2400 -General powers and duties of health regulatory boards

The general powers and duties of health regulatory boards shall be:

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6. To promulgate regulations in accordance with the Administrative Process Act (§ 9-6.14:1 et seq.) which are reasonable and necessary to administer effectively the regulatory system. Such regulations shall not conflict with the purposes and intent of this chapter or of Chapter 1 (§ <u>54.1-100</u> et seq.) and Chapter 25 (§ <u>54.1-2500</u> et seq.) of this title. ...

The specific statutory mandate for continuing education for social workers is:

§ 54.1-3708. Continuing education requirements.

The Board shall establish in regulations requirements for the continuing education of licensed social workers.

The Board may approve persons who provide continuing education or accredit continuing education programs in order to accomplish the purposes of this section.

Substance

Currently the Board's regulations require a minimum of 30 contact hours of continuing education for each biennial licensure renewal. A minimum of two of those hours must pertain to the standards of practice and laws governing the profession of social work in Virginia, or the Code of Ethics of one of the social work professional associations listed in the regulation. The hours may be obtained from a combination of board-approved activities in the two categories - Category I. Formally Organized Learning Activities with a minimum of 20 hours; and Category II. Individual Professional Activities with a maximum of 10 of the required 30 hours.

The majority of the courses and activities available in social work pertain primarily to the practice of a licensed clinical social worker (LCSW), defined in § 54.1-3700 as a "social worker who, by education and experience, is professionally qualified at the autonomous practice level to provide direct diagnostic, preventive and treatment services where functioning is threatened or affected by social and psychological stress or health impairment." While the decisions and activities of a licensed social worker (LSW) are important to the client for whom services are being provided, the complexity of the cases and the client issues seen by a licensed clinical social worker require a higher level of education and training and demand a greater depth of knowledge, skills and abilities. Therefore, it is necessary (and statutorily mandated) to retain

continuing education regulations for LSW's, but the health, safety and welfare of the public may continue to be protected with a somewhat reduced CE requirement.

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Alternatives

Please describe all viable alternatives to the proposed regulatory action that have been or will be considered to meet the essential purpose of the action.

There is precedence with other health professions for a differential in the amount of continuing education for persons licensed in the same profession but at a different level of competency and autonomy. In Medicine, radiologic technologists-limited are required to have half the amount of continuing education required for radiologic technologist. In Physical Therapy, the same is true for physical therapy assistants versus physical therapists.

While the Code of Virginia mandates continuing education for all types of social workers, it does not specify the number of hours or the content of those hours, which are determined by regulations promulgated by the Board. Following public comment on the NOIRA, the Board will consider a number of factors in recommending proposed amendments to the continuing education requirements, including the availability of coursework in a variety of subjects, the number of ethics hours and their applicability to social work practice, and the ratio of Category I and Category II hours required.
