The Office of the Attorney General's Regulatory Reform Task Force recommended that a preamble be added to the regulation as required by statute. Section 3.1-106.4 B of the Code of Virginia authorizes the Board of Agriculture and Consumer Services to promulgate regulations and directs that the regulation shall contain a preamble stating: "The Board will receive, consider, and respond to petitions by any interested person at any time with respect to reconsideration or revision of such regulation." This amendment adds that preamble by adding section 2 VAC 5-400-5 to the regulation.

On December 6, 2007, the Board of Agriculture and Consumer Services approved the proposed amendments to 2 VAC 5-400, Rules and Regulations for the Enforcement of the Virginia Fertilizer Law.
