The Board completed its review of each of its regulations and amended any overly burdensome requirements, removed any obsolete information and provided more clarity with clear direct regulations.

The Board conducted a general review of each of its regulations in accordance to the provisions of Executive Directive 1, the Board identified areas that could provide clarity to and combine areas that were no longer applicable.

18VAC25-21-20 states entry requirements for auctioneers. The language is reworded and clarified.

18VAC25-21-40 states entry requirements for reciprocity. Repealed as it is specified in the statute.

- 18VAC25-21-50 explains application requirements. The language is reworded and clarified.
- 18VAC25-21-60 explains the auctioneer's exam; this regulation is to be repealed; it is repeated in another regulation.

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- 18VAC25-21-80 explains the renewal requirements. A portion of this information is redundant.
- 18VAC25-21-90 explains the late renewal fee and reinstatement requirements. A portion of this information is redundant.
- 18VAC25-21-100 requirements for advertising; this regulation is to be repealed as it is listed in the statute.
- 18VAC25-21-110 states the requirements of a contract. The language is reworded and clarified.
- 18VAC25-21-130 explains requirements of displaying a license; this regulation is to be repealed because it is unnecessary.
- 18VAC25-21-140 explains the documentation to be provided to the owner; this regulation is reworded and clarified.
- 18VAC25-21-150 explains the requirements of escrow funds. The language is reworded and clarified.
- 18VAC25-21-160 explains how long records are to be saved; this regulation is to be repealed because it was better suited in regulation 18VAC25-21-140.
- 18VAC25-21-180 defines what actions are subject to discipline. A portion is deleted because it is unnecessary.
- 18VAC25-21-190 defines what is on the school of auctioneering application. The language is reworded and clarified for ease of reading.
- 18VAC25-21-200 explains school of auctioneering course requirements. This regulation is to be repealed because it is better suited in regulation 18VAC25-21-190.
- 18VAC25-21-210 reporting of changes to the board. This regulation is to be repealed because it is better suited in regulation 18VAC25-21-190.
- 18VAC25-21-220 explains periodic requalification for continued course approval. This regulation is to be repealed because it is better suited in regulation 18VAC25-21-190.
- 18VAC25-21-230 provides application and criteria for continuing education course approval. This regulation is to be repealed because it is in statute.
- 18VAC25-21-240 explains administration of courses. This regulation is to be repealed because it is unnecessary.
- 18VAC25-21-250 explains continuing education requirements for renewal or reinstatement. This regulation is to be repealed because it is in statute.

18VAC25-21-270 reporting of changes to the board. This regulation is to be repealed because it is unnecessary.

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18VAC25-21-280 explains the periodic requalification for continued course approval. This regulation is to be repealed because it is unnecessary.
