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Legal basis

The Code of Virginia (1950) as amended, § 32.1-325, grants to the Board of Medical Assistance Services the authority to administer and amend the Plan for Medical Assistance. The Code of Virginia (1950) as amended, § 32.1-324, authorizes the Director of DMAS to administer and amend the Plan for Medical Assistance according to the Board's requirements. The Medicaid authority as established by § 1902 (a) of the Social Security Act [42 U.S.C. 1396a] provides governing authority for payments for services, and § 1915 (c) of the Social Security Act provides for home and community based waiver programs such as the Day Support Waiver for Individuals with Mental Retardation.

Purpose

The purpose of this action is to establish a new program, the Day Support Waiver for Individuals with Mental Retardation ("Day Support Waiver"), to provide day support, prevocational services and supported employment services for individuals who are waiting to receive services under the Mental Retardation Waiver ("MR Waiver"). In September 2005, there were approximately 2,900 individuals waiting to receive services under the Mental Retardation Waiver ("MR Waiver"). Individuals in the Day Support Waiver program will receive services until they are no longer eligible for Day Support Waiver services. This action will help protect the health and welfare of the citizens of the Commonwealth by providing enhanced services in the community for Medicaid enrollees awaiting services under the Mental Retardation Waiver program.

Substance

New regulations containing the policy and procedures for the Day Support Waiver were developed in consultation with members of the General Assembly and in collaboration with DMHMRSAS and the MR Waiver Advisory Committee. The regulations are contained in six new sections under 12 VAC 30-120, Department of Medical Assistance Services, Waivered Services. The six sections are: 12 VAC 30-120-1500, which contains definitions of Day Support Waiver terms; 12 VAC 30-120-1510, which contains general coverage and requirements for Day Support Waiver services; 12 VAC 30-120-1520, which outlines individual eligibility requirements; 12 VAC 30-120-1530, which defines general requirements for home and community-based participating providers; 12 VAC 30-120-1540, which defines participation standards for home and community-based waiver services participating providers; and 12 VAC 30-120-1550, which further defines the covered services and outlines requirements for providers of these services.

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This Waiver covers only those individuals who have a diagnosis of mental retardation. Day support services include training, assistance, and specialized supervision in the acquisition, retention, or improvement of self-help, socialization, and adaptive skills, which typically take place outside the home. Day support services shall focus on enabling the individual to attain or maintain his maximum functional level. Prevocational services are those services aimed at preparing an individual for paid or unpaid employment. They do not include activities that are specifically job-task oriented but focus on concepts such as accepting supervision, attendance, task completion, problem solving and safety. Compensation, if provided, is less than 50% of the minimum wage. DMAS is adding supported employment services to the final regulation, which is a change from the proposed regulation. Supported employment services are provided in work settings where persons without disabilities are employed. It is especially designed for individuals with developmental disabilities, including individuals with mental retardation, who face severe impediments to employment due to the nature and complexity of their disabilities, irrespective of age or vocational potential.

The primary advantage of these proposed regulations is that the Day Support Waiver provides an alternative for those individuals on the MR Waiver waiting list who could benefit from day support and prevocational services. By providing services to individuals with mental retardation in the community, the waiver is also intended to help delay or prevent institutional placement, thereby improving the health, safety and welfare of citizens of Virginia. There are no known disadvantages of these regulations to the agency, the public or the Commonwealth.

Public comment

DMAS' proposed regulations were published in the July 24, 2006 (VR 22:23) *Virginia Register* for their comment period from July 24, 2006 through September 22, 2006. The comments received are set forth below.

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The Agency comments from the following: The Arc of Virginia (The Arc), The Dept. of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services (DMHMRSAS), Endependence, Cumberland Mountain Community Services Board (Cumberland), The Virginia Association of Community Services Boards (VACSB), which responded on behalf of, and in agreement with, all 40 CSBs in Virginia, The Virginia Board for People with Disabilities (VBPD), and The Virginia Network of Private Providers ("The Network). Where all of the groups who provided comments are indicated, DMAS shall use the reference, "the Commenters." The comments are summarized as follows:

12 VAC 30-120-1500 (Definitions)

All of the Commenters except Cumberland suggested that DMAS add Supported Employment to Section 12 VAC 30-120-1500 (Definitions) and to 12 VAC 30-120-1510 (General coverage and requirements for Day Support Waiver Services), and to other sections as appropriate, because this service option for the Day Support Waiver was specified by the General Assembly in 2006. The Network and the VACSB also recommended that DMAS update the Code of Virginia references in this section to reflect the recodification effective October of 2005.

<u>DMAS Response</u>: DMAS agrees to the addition of Supported Employment as a Day Support Waiver services, in accordance with recent action by the Virginia General Assembly. The definition of the service and appropriate descriptive language will be added to the regulations.

DMAS has updated all Code of Virginia references, as appropriate.

12 VAC 30-120-1510 (General coverage and requirements for Day Support Waiver Services)

Endependence urged DMAS to "[m]aintain current language regarding the allocation of slots," and the VBPD stated that "[t]he person-centered allocation system for Day Support Waiver slots currently used, based on the chronological application date continues to support the Board's vision for availability and access of services statewide." The VBPD also urged DMAS to increase the number of slots available.

All the other Commenters urged DMAS change the manner in which slots are allocated, referring to the current centralized slot allocation process as "cumbersome to the point of being a barrier to access to services" and time consuming, and noting that that the current process makes effective care planning difficult. This group of the Commenters advanced several models upon which DMAS might base the reorganization of the slot allocation process. This point appeared to be the area of most concern for the Commenters.

<u>DMAS Response</u>: DMAS agrees to the suggestion that the slot allocation process be modified to create more timely access to services for recipients. The regulations have been adjusted accordingly.

12 VAC 30-120-1520 (Individual eligibility requirements)

The Network, The Arc and the VACSB urged DMAS to use person-centered language in the MR Day Support regulations.

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<u>DMAS Response</u>: The Agency has made many enhancements to the regulations that reflect person-centered planning. DMAS has made as many person-centered references as possible.

12 VAC 30-120-1540 (Participation standards for home and community-based waiver services participating providers)

Both DMHMRSAS and The Network suggested that DMAS change the time frames in this section to be consistent with the wording in the MR Waiver regulations (i.e., change "10 working days" and "10 calendar days" to "10 business days" and change "within 72 hours" to "within 3 working days." In items #1 and #2 in this same subsection, "12 calendar days" should be "10 business days" to facilitate consistency with the MR Waiver regulations.).

<u>DMAS Response</u>: DMAS agrees that stated time frames must be clear and has made regulation changes to reflect business days in various locations.

Language regarding the CSP development process was updated to reflect that CSPs are developed with individuals and their families and that modifications to CSPs must be approved by the individual or family/caregiver. 2. Language regarding the restriction of waiver services to individuals in institutions was moved from this section to 12VAC30-120-1510(B) to be consistent with a change made to the MR Waiver regulations at the recommendation of the Office of the Attorney General. 3. Clarified that monthly visits must take place at the individual's placement for those individuals who reside in DSS-licensed placements.
12VAC30-120-1530	General requirements for home and community-based participating providers	The following change was made in the proposed permanent regulations: Added language to clarify documentation requirements in the provider's attendance log.
12VAC30-120-1550	Services: Day Support and Prevocational Services	The following changes were made in the proposed permanent regulations: 1. Added requirement that staff providing services be trained prior to providing direct services to be consistent with the CMS approved application. 2. Added language to provide further clarification of provider requirements for billing during transportation.
