The proposed regulations will modify 12 VAC 220 et seq of the Virginia Administrative Code to establish the certification requirements for early intervention case managers. The current emergency regulations governing the certification requirements of early intervention case managers have been in effect since February 1, 2012. As of July 2012, 389 professionals have been certified as early intervention case managers with no identified regulatory issues .No change in the emergency regulations that are currently in force is being proposed.

Statement of final agency action

The Governor has designated the department as the lead agency for early intervention services provided through Part C of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (20 USC § 1431 et seq.). The duties of the department include promulgating regulations and adopting policies and procedures to implement an early intervention services system and assure consistent and equitable access to such services in consultation with participating agencies, contracting with local lead agencies for implementation of the early intervention services system statewide, providing technical assistance to local early intervention systems, and establishing an interagency system of monitoring and supervising the early intervention system. See Chapter 53 (§ 2.2-5300 et seq.) of Title 2.2 of the Code of Virginia.

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Effective February 1, 2012, emergency regulations establish the requirements and process for the certification of early intervention case managers to provide coordination of early intervention services and supports for children and their families under the federal Part C program.

Because the authority to promulgate regulations to comply with the requirements of the federal Part C program was given to the Department, action by the State Board of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services is not required.

The Department has the legal authority to promulgate these regulations under Virginia Code § 2.2-5304 and Chapter 890 of the 2011 Virginia Acts of Assembly (Budget Bill Item 304#Q)

Purpose

These regulations provide specific requirements for certification of early intervention case managers under Virginia's early intervention services system, as required by Pub.L.No.108-446 § 635(9) and the standards established in 42 CFR 431.51. Virginia Code § 2.2-5304 designates the Department as the state lead agency responsible for implementing Virginia's early intervention services system and ensuring compliance with the applicable federal requirements. The goal of these regulations is to ensure the competence of early intervention case managers under the authority granted to the lead agency. The regulations also provide the basis for the Department to certify qualified individuals to coordinate the early intervention services and supports provided to children and their families and allow these individuals to receive reimbursement for the coordination services provided under the Medicaid State Plan Sec. 1902. [42 U.S.C. 1396a] (a). The Department consulted with the public, providers, and other state agencies, including Department of Medical Assistance Services, in developing these regulations.

Rationale for using fast track process

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Please note: If an objection to the use of the fast-track process is received within the 30-day public comment period from 10 or more persons, any member of the applicable standing committee of either house of the General Assembly or of the Joint Commission on Administrative Rules, the agency shall (i) file notice of the objections with the Registrar of Regulations for publication in the Virginia Register, and (ii) proceed with the normal promulgation process with the initial publication of the fast-track regulation serving as the Notice of Intended Regulatory Action.

The emergency regulations provide practitioners the opportunity to qualify for Medicaid reimbursement and reflect federal and state requirements. Nearly 390 individuals have been certified as Early Intervention Case Managers under the emergency regulations that became effective February 1, 2012. The Virginia Interagency Coordinating Council (VICC) supports adoption of permanent regulations.

Adoption of permanent regulations will permit individuals providing care coordination for the early intervention service system to pursue certification and currently-certified early intervention case managers to continue receiving reimbursement for services performed and accumulate the additional educational credentials require for certification renewal.

This regulatory action revises existing regulations. The substantive changes include:

- A definition of early intervention case management and a requirement for specified providers of this service under the Medicaid State Plan to be certified by the Department;
- Specific criteria for practitioners to be certified as early intervention case managers;
- Application process requirements for initial certification, recertification, and the restoration of an expired certification; and
- Processes for practitioners to seek reconsideration of a decision to deny certification.

This action poses no disadvantages to the public or the Commonwealth. These regulations establish a certifications process for early intervention case managers that assures individuals completing the certification process are appropriately and adequately prepared and trained to coordinate services to

infant and toddlers with disabilities. The regulations establish the criteria for maintenance of the certification which allows practitioners to seek reimbursement for services rendered.

Requirements more restrictive than federal

These regulations address the requirements of Pub.L.No.108-446 § 635(9) and meet the standards established in 42 CFR 431.51 for certification of early intervention practitioners under Virginia's early intervention services system. The regulations are not more restrictive than federal requirements and reflect professional practice standards in Virginia.

The primary advantage of these regulations is that they will help to ensure that providers have the expertise to effectively address the needs of Virginia's children with developmental delays and their families under the federal Part C program and are therefore essential to protect health, safety, and welfare of this vulnerable population.

The proposed regulations also will allow for expanded reimbursement for early intervention service coordination under Medicaid, thereby maximizing the availability of federal and state funding under Part C of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act.

A possible disadvantage is that providers will need to spend their time to complete training and submit an application. It takes approximately 15 minutes to complete the application and approximately 2 hours for the training.

There are no viable alternatives to this proposed regulatory action. In the Department's role as State lead agency for Virginia's early intervention services system, it has adopted policies and procedures, as well as providing guidance documents, policy letters, related interpretive materials, and technical assistance that defined and ensured that Virginia's early intervention service system was consistent with federal regulations. The Department considered various alternative criteria and processes, including the revision of current policies and procedures, to comply with the requirements of Part C of IDEA 2004. However, the Office of the Attorney General has advised the Department that regulations are required to strengthen the Department's ability to supervise and monitor service providers under Virginia's Part C program.

Businesses will be able to pursue reimbursement for Early Intervention services, which were not previously reimbursable.

	The proposed regulations also will allow for expanded reimbursement for early intervention services under Medicaid, thereby maximizing the availability of federal and state funding under Part C of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act.

There are no viable alternatives to this proposed regulatory action. The Department considered various alternative criteria and processes, including the revision of current policies and procedures, to comply with the current federal and state requirements. However, the Office of the Attorney General has advised the Department that regulations are necessary because all public and private practitioners are required to adhere to the provisions for certification.

Family impact

This proposed regulatory action should have a positive impact on the children with developmental delays and their families who are eligible to receive services under the federal Part C program. These regulations govern practitioners who provide service coordination for children and their families to ensure that services are responsive to individual needs. Early intervention services help individuals and families attain self-sufficiency, self-pride, and ultimately help children with disabilities attain self-sufficiency and self-pride. The regulatory actions should not have any impact on family income.
