The regulation implements the Economic and Employment Improvement Program for Disadvantaged Persons (Program). The Program is designed to improve the employability of disadvantaged persons through education and job training. The regulation is essential to protect the welfare of citizens as it implements a program which assists disadvantaged individuals with securing employment and moving from minimum wage jobs to a better paying job and/or college thus facilitating career development and economic independence.

The regulation implements the Economic and Employment Improvement Program for Disadvantaged Persons (Program). The regulation further defines the requirements necessary for projects to receive grant awards for the Program and additional provisions establishing eligibility criteria for projects designed to serve certain hard-to-employ persons. The changes made included a new word "Demographics" added to the definitions and other language that might limit eligibility for grant awards was struck.

The primary advantage of the regulation is that it protects the welfare of participants by providing ongoing services to reduce long-term dependence on welfare and emphasizes personal responsibility by enhancing opportunities for personal initiative and self-sufficiency by promoting the value of work. The primary advantage of the regulation to the Department of Social Services and the Commonwealth is that it assists disadvantaged individuals with securing employment thereby reducing long-term dependence on welfare. There are no known disadvantages of this regulation to the public or the Commonwealth.

There have been four (4) changes made to the text of the proposed regulation since its publication. They are:

- 1. The addition of a definition of "demographics" as it applies to this regulation;

- 3. A change in the language at 22 VAC 40-375-20 (B)(5) to correspond with the definition of demographics and to give demographics less emphasis; and,

4. The removal of 22 VAC 40-375-50 (3) to limit the eligibility restrictions.

Section 22 VAC 40-375-10: a definition of "Demographics" was added and language limiting eligibility for the program was struck in the definition of "Disadvantaged."

Section 22 VAC 40-375-20: language was changed to clarify that demographics would be taken into consideration in the awarding of grants.

Section 22 VAC 40-375-50 (3) was struck to remove potential additional limits on eligibility.
