

The definition of "family day home" in § 63.2-100 of the Code of Virginia is being amended, effective July 1, 2016, to lower the threshold required for licensure to five children at any one time, exclusive of the provider's own children and any children residing in the home. The definition of "family day home" in 22VAC-40-111-10 is amended to reflect this Code change, to comply with House Bill 1570 and Senate Bill 1168 (2015).

The State Board of Social Services approved final action on 22VAC40-111, Standards for Licensed Family Day Homes, on August 17, 2016.

Family impact

The changes to the regulation will strengthen the protections and increase the supervision for children in care by requiring licensure at a lower threshold. The changes to the regulation should not have an impact in encouraging or discouraging economic self-sufficiency, assumption of responsibility, or marital commitment. Disposable family income may be decreased if the cost of child care increases. The Department has no discretion in this action as it is the result of a Code change.
