Purpose

The purpose of this regulation shall be to establish a separate state program, as that term is defined by federal regulations governing the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) program, 45 CFR §260.30, for the purpose of providing cash assistance payments to able-bodied two-parent families. The separate state program shall be funded by state funds and operated outside of the TANF program.

Basis

Pursuant to §63.1-25 of the Code of Virginia, the State Board of Social Services has authority to promulgate rules and regulations necessary for operation of all assistance programs.

The 2000 Virginia Acts of Assembly, State Budget Item 381 B (http://leg1.state.va.us/cgi-bin/legp504.exe?001+bud+21-381), mandates the Department of Social Services to establish a separate state program for the purpose of providing welfare cash assistance payments to able-bodied two-parent families. These regulations are necessary for the state to regulate a separate state two-parent cash assistance program and make emergency regulations that will be promulgated before April 2001.

Substance

The separate state program regulation will establish program rules for a cash assistance program for two-parent families to be funded by state funds and operated outside of the Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF) program.

Most of the conditions and eligibility requirements will be the same for the separate state program as in the TANF program, however, the Department of Social Services is investigating changes in the following areas:

- ? requiring both parents' signatures on the application;
- ? mandatory assessments of both parents in Virginia Initiative for Employment not Welfare (VIEW);
- ? applicant job search and/or job readiness programs;
- ? reviewing the 90 day period in which the recipient must be in a work activity; and
- ? considering changes to exempt resources and the resource limit.

The basic benefit payment for which families are eligible under the separate state program will not be less than what they would have received under TANF.

Alternatives

The following alternatives have been considered:

1. Provide cash assistance and employment services to able-bodied two-parent families through the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) program. This is the current arrangement. To avoid a state sanction for failure to meet the two-parent work participation rate, the 2000 Virginia Acts of Assembly directed the Department of Social Services to establish a separate state program.

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- 2. Provide cash assistance and employment services to able-bodied two-parent families using state funds and current TANF rules. This arrangement would be considered a segregated state program. As such, it would be subject to federal work participation requirements and penalties.
- 3. Provide cash assistance and employment services to able-bodied two-parent families using state funds and rules designed specifically for two-parent families. Under this arrangement, the federal work participation requirements and penalties will no longer apply.

Family Impact Statement

Parents in the home, pursuing and/or gainfully employed will provide positive role models for their children. Providing cash assistance as these families seek self-sufficiency strengthens the occasion for both parents to participate in the education, nurturing, and supervision of their children on a daily basis, thereby keeping families intact.

This regulation encourages the economic self-sufficiency, self-pride and assumption of responsibility of both parents for their children as well as the family unit as a whole. With the potential for greater allowable reserves, parents will be able to acquire resources that will permit both parents to seek and keep employment.

This regulation encourages parents to continue a level of stability in the lives of their children that may eventually lead to marriage. Allowing families to grow together towards economic self-sufficiency should prevent the financial stress that often causes families in poverty to break up.

The disposable family income should increase as both parents pursue gainful employment. The overall goal of this program will be to encourage able-bodied parents to move from welfare to work, in a manner that will allow the parents to maintain integrity and pride.
