The State Police wish to promulgate a fast-track regulation for regulations governing Approved Helmets for All-Terrain Vehicles and Mopeds on November 20, 2008.

of the Snell Memorial Foundation, the American National Standards Institute, Inc., or the federal Department of Transportation.
